- Trade Facilitation is one of the key missions


Japan's initiative for trade facilitation in Asia Region

Japan's Approach




Tailor made capacity building for each country



Purpose


Sharing Japan's Customs experience and knowledge




Part 2 <u>Japan's Continuous Effort for Customs Modernisation</u>

NACCS (Overview)



- Consolidated EDI platform system
- Jointly used system by public (government) and private stakeholders
- Completely track and monitor the movement of goods and means of transport
- High speed response, 24hr-365days operation

Japan's AEO Programmes

AEO (Authorized Economic Operator)

Japan Customs provide benefits such as simplified and expeditious procedures to operators meeting the requirements such as security and compliance.

Requirements

(Consistent with WCO SAFE)

- O Good Compliance Record
- O Proper ability to conduct operations
- O Internal Compliance Program
 - Organizational Set-up
 - Due Customs Procedures
 - Cargo/Conveyance/Premises Security
 - Internal Audit
 - Contracting Parties Requirement
 - Communication with Customs
 - Crisis Management
 - Education/Training

Examples of Benefits

Authorized Importers

- Pre-arrival lodgment of import declaration and pre-arrival
- import permission early release of cargo
- Reduced number of elements for import declaration
- Reduced examination and inspection at the time of import
- Periodical lodgment of duty/tax payment declaration

<u>Authorized Exporters</u>

- Export procedures are completed while keeping the cargo in their own premises
- Reduced examination and inspection at the time of export




Mutual Recognition of AEO Programmes
