CAREC Program Development Effectiveness Review (DEfR)

- The CAREC DEfR aims to function both as a monitoring tool for the effectiveness of the program, and as a platform to initiate specific priority actions.
- The Energy Work Plan 2013-2015 will be subject to DEfR.



CAREC Program DEfR

 Infrastructure development work in the power sector, represented by indicators (such as transmission lines installed or upgraded, generation capacity added) will capture how such physical operations have contributed to energy security, efficiency, and ability to enhance power trade in the CAREC region



CAREC Program DEfR

- The average volume of approved investment projects in the energy sector will capture progress with regard to the mobilization of funds in the sector.
- The time spent (person-days) by participants in energy sector-related training programs, sponsored or assisted by CAREC, will reflect progress with regard to capacity building in the sector.



CAREC Program DEfR

- Development outcomes in the CAREC Program
 Results Framework, directly related to the energy sector:
 - Intra and inter-regional energy trade (GWh)
 - GDP per energy use (\$ per TOE)
 - Foreign direct investment in the energy sector (% of GDP)
