Strategy and Development Plans

- Regional: Three-Year Rolling Plan (2010-2012) under preparation
- KGZ: Road Sector Development Strategy updated
- MON: Transit Mongolia Program formulated
- PRC: Revised Medium- and Long-term Railway Network Plan approved on 31 October 2008
- UZB: National Highway Development Program for 2009-2014 approved on 22 April 2009



Institutional Development

- National Joint Transport and Trade
 Facilitation Committees or similar
 organizations established in all CAREC
 countries
- Collaboration between the Transport Sector Coordinating Committee and Customs Cooperation Committee for implementing the Action Plan



Physical Investment

- AFG: ADB's tranche 1 grant (\$60 million) of the Multitranche Financing Facility (MFF) for the Road Network Development Program approved in Nov 2008 to improve Andkhoy-Qaisar road (Corridors 3b, 6ab); WB's \$18 million grant approved in Dec 2008 to improve urban roads in Kabul (Corridors 5, 6c).
- AZE: Two WB loans approved in 2008 (Rail Trade and Transport Facilitation and Highway II) under implementation (Corridor 2).



Physical Investment

- KAZ: Western Europe–Western China International Transport Corridor Project (Corridor 1b) under implementation with external assistance
 - ADB: \$700 million MFF (with tranche 1 loan of \$340 million) approved in Nov 2008 for 480 km Zhambyl Oblast section.
 - IsDB: \$186 million loan approved in Feb 2009 for 58 km Zhambyl Oblast section.
 - EBRD: \$181 million loan approved in Nov 2008 for 102 km Aktobe-Russian border section.
 - WB: \$2 billion loan approved in April 2009 for 1,062 km Shymkent-Aktobe/Kyzylorda oblast border section.

Physical Investment

- KGZ: ADB's \$20 million grant approved in Nov 2008 to improve the Bishkek–Torugart road (Corridor 1c).
- MON: JICA's \$288 million loan approved in 2008 to finance construction of the new Ulaanbaatar airport.
- PRC: Government will invest RMB120 billion (\$18 billion) to improve roads in Xinjiang, linking the borders in Ala Shankou (Corridors 1a, b), Takeshiken (Corridor 4a), and Torugart (Corridor 1c) during 2009-2013.
- TAJ: ADB's supplementary grant of \$20 million for the Dushanbe–Kyrgyz Border Road Rehabilitation Project (Corridors 3, 5) at an advance stage of preparation.
- UZB: ADB-assisted Regional Road Project under implementation (Corridor 2a).



Nonphysical Investment

- A Cross-border Transport Agreement among KGZ, PRC, and TAJ under development with ADB support; 1st negotiation meeting held in Dushanbe on 19-20 May 2009.
- Impact evaluation for KAZ: Western Europe– Western China International Transport Corridor Project (Corridor 1b) and KGZ: Bishkek–Torugart Road Rehabilitation Project (Corridor 1c) started with ADB assistance.
- Corridor performance measurement and monitoring activities started in March 2009.



Nonphysical Investment

- AFG: Study on railway development and detailed design of a railway line from Hairatan to Mazar-e-Sharif, with ADB's TA (\$1.2 million) approved on 27 March 2009.
- KAZ: Feasibility studies on electrification of the Almaty-Aktogay, Dostyk-Aktogay, and Aktogay-Mointy railway lines completed in December 2008.
- KGZ: Environmental and social analysis of the Osh– Isfana road rehabilitation project, with EBRD's €1.4 million grant.
- PRC: Feasibility studies and preliminary designs for the Xi'an-Lanzhou passenger line and Lanzhou-Urumqi second double tracking line completed. Transport and trade facilitation assessment in Inner Mongolia Autonomous Region started in May 2009.
