- Exploring Collaboration with USAID's RESET program in identified areas for the next three years.
- Capacity Building and knowledge exchange activities conducted and needs for three years identified.
- Assessment of the opportunities and challenges in strengthening electricity dispatch and system operations across Central Asia completed.

## Pillar 3: Energy-Water Linkages (Phase 1)

#### **Objectives**

- I. To strengthen cooperation and dialogue by integrating energy and water analysis
- To better understand the linkages between energy and water across Central Asia countries (and AFG)

III. To develop a mutually agreed analytical tool (e.g., mathematical model) as a basis for evaluating energy and water management and investments

Note: This activity does not seek to establish or review allocations of water among countries.

#### Pillar 3: Activities as of Today

#### September 2009/10:

Workshops at regional and national levels – Brainstorming on energy and water needs and opportunities

#### Feb/March 2011:

# National workshops in Kazakhstan, Kyrgyz Republic, Tajikistan, and Afghanistan

- To define priority issues, criteria and design parameters for an energywater decision support system from national perspectives
- Reviewed results of a survey of existing models
- Presentation and discussion of similar efforts (Kabul, Canada, World Bank demonstration model)
- Discussion and agreement to establish national technical working groups and a regional level, with senior government approval

Ongoing: Development of an independent demonstration model of water resources in Central Asia based on existing, publically available data

### **Pillar 3: Looking Forward**

#### Complete national workshops

- World Bank and CAREC look forward to completing similar workshops in Uzbekistan and Turkmenistan to understand priorities for modeling
- Additional workshops in Afghanistan

# Build on basis for regional model and decision support system

- Build on strong thread of common interests (e.g., drinking water, agriculture, winter energy security, environment)
- Undertake detailed review of most promising existing models
- Engage senior government in establishing national technical teams, and advising on participation in regional workshop
- Regional workshop (Fall 2011) to review models and agree on the specifications for a Terms of Reference for a new/strengthened regional decision support system on energy-water linkages
