Customs Automation

- Kyrgyz Republic and Tajikistan drafting customs automation masterplans
 - software applications (united automated information system),
 - communication infrastructure, and
 - training and change management
- needs assessment for customs modernization in Mongolia completed
 - ADB approved the investment project aimed at modernizing Mongolia's customs administration. The project, to be implemented during March 2007 to February 2010,
- Regional seminars
 - on customs automation in Beijing in late-May 2007
 - two more training programs in Shanghai for mid-level customs officials during the second half of 2007.

Risk Management and Post-Entry Audit

- Seminar on Implementation Challenges in Joint Customs Control, Risk Management and Post Entry Audit held in February 2007 in Bangkok in cooperation with the WCO and Royal Thai Customs;
- A Working Group meeting, chaired by Uzbekistan, was convened during the seminar to discuss ongoing initiatives in risk management and post-entry audit.

Joint Customs Control and One-Stop Services

Progress

- Kazakhstan and PRC will establish a joint working group during the first quarter of 2007
- Mongolia and PRC have already established working group
- Kyrgyzstan and Kazakhstan are currently pilot testing JCC at the Aktilek-Karasu border.

Implementation Challenges

- cooperation between border authorities,
- a lead coordinating agency at the national level, and
- detailing the functions of customs officers under JCC in a formal memorandum of agreement.

Regional Transit Development

- TIR seminar in October 2006 in Mongolia. TIR is system to ensure
 - fewer delays in goods transit,
 - protection of customs revenues,
 - reduction of physical inspection of goods, and
 - efficient customs control and documentation.
- locally issued TIR carnets are expected to increase significantly upon
 - accession of the PRC to the TIR Convention
 - completion of the Central North-South Corridor Road financed by ADB that links Russia and the PRC's Tianjin port through Ulaanbaatar

Harmonization of Customs Procedures

- the program is supporting
 - harmonization of cargo manifest, and
 - mutual recognition of customs inspections and seals/stamps
- PRC and Kazakhstan, as well as PRC and Mongolia, will pilot-test the initiative under their existing cooperation framework.
- Simplification and harmonization are also being achieved
 - revision of customs codes,
 - introduction of risk management practices,
 - JCC, and
 - business process reengineering in relation to customs automation.

Bilateral Initiatives for Data Exchanges

Preliminary Discussions on

30/03/2007

- the establishment of an electronic platform for data exchange,
- drafting of an agreement to provide the legal basis for the initiative.
- the Kyrgyz Republic and Uzbekistan, and Tajikistan and Kazakhstan, have initiated bilateral discussion on pilot-testing the initiative.
- CCC requested ADB assistance to provide a consultant in this area.

Trade Logistics

- A conference on trade logistics development in Mongolia and Inner Mongolia of the PRC was held in November 2006 in Erenhot, Inner Mongolia
- A preliminary joint action plan will be developed and submitted to the two Governments for review
 - finalization of transport agreements;
 - improving transport networks and corridors;
 - expansion of dry ports and inland depots;
 - cold chain development and collaboration;
 - promoting inter-modalism;
 - building logistics and transport information systems
 - efficient data exchange and integration;
 - logistics human resources development;
 - development of special economic zones..

Trade Facilitation and Trade Policy

- Integrating various areas of trade facilitation (quarantine, immigration, etc) and trade logistics into CCC and make it a true TFC
 - Cooperation in quarantine as part of combating avian flu etc,
 - Enhance agriculture product standards for exports
 - Private sector participation in promoting trade logistics development
- Enhancing cooperation with the Trade Policy Committee
 - Close liaise with members of the Trade Policy Committee
 - Coordinate policy reform agenda
