CAREC Advanced Transit System (CATS) Pilot Implementation

Pilot countries: Azerbaijan, Georgia, Kazakhstan; Presented the concept and progress at the WCO Global Transit Conference

- Focal Points appointed in all 3 pilot countries
- 3 working groups being organized comprised of customs officials and private sector
 - Legal and regulatory
 - Information technology
 - Risk management
- Nominees from private sector have been received
- Major output of working groups Trilateral Agreement



CAREC Advanced Transit System (CATS) Pilot Implementation

Timeline

- Blueprint for agreement to be submitted to governments by end Aug 2017 by consultancy team
- Working Groups to prepare Draft Trilateral Agreement before end of August 2017
- Workshop to discuss details of draft agreement and establish foundations for implementing Pilot Prototype - 25-26 September 2017, Almaty, KAZ
- Final Trilateral Agreement by end 2017
- Implementation of pilot Starts January 2018





Information Common Exchange (ICE)

- Technical specification for the transit and pre-arrival message exchange being finalized.
- Message specification will be based on WCO DM XML Data Model v3.5; will be one of the first region-wide use of the WCO Data Model in the world.
- System will be demonstrated to working groups on 25-26
 September in Almaty



Assessment of WTO Trade Facilitation Agreement (TFA) Implementation

- TFA: for simplifation of procedures for import, export and transit with a total of 3 sections, 23 articles, and 36 provisions
- Full implementation of TFA can reduce worldwide trade costs by between 12.5% and 17.5%
- Requirements upon entry into force
 - Categories A, B, and C designations notified to WTO
 - National Committee on Trade Facilitation
- Assessments:
 - most commonly notified measures in different categories;
 - Specific requirements by countries

- Common areas with most countries indicated designations
 - For immediate and effective implementation of Category A designations
 - To meet specific capacity building needs for Category B and C designations
- Selected additional areas with regional significance
 - Information transparency, result management, risk management, coordinate border management, single windows
- National Committee on Trade Facilitation

Through existing and new investment projects and TAs, in coordination with other development partners



New Trade Facilitation Strategic Framework

- New strategic framework , consistent with the new forthcoming CAREC Strategy 2030 and supports TFA implementation
 - Continue and deepen the existing areas of competence such as in customs and selected areas of integrated trade facilitation
 - Adopt and implement the latest global agenda on trade facilitation, i.e., WTO TFA
 - Reach out to related existing and new sectoral, cross-sectoral and broader policy areas where trade facilitation plays key roles, such as transport, agriculture, SME development, cross-border finance, crossborder economic zone, regional and global value chain, and ecommerce, etc;
 - Evaluate results objectively and continuously and strengthen implementation and adjust the program accordingly
 - Crush institutional silos for seamless exchange of information and effective coordination

- 2. TFA implementation collaboration with other donors to avoid overlaps
- 3. Investment and technical assistance projects
- 4. New strategic framework for trade facilitation
