

Good practice in SPS technical cooperation

Paris Principles on Aid Effectiveness being applied in SPS area but room for improvement

More efforts needed to:

- •Ensure national ownership
- •Assess and prioritize needs
- •Promote public private collaboration
- •Link skills development to practice
- •Manage for results
- •etc.



What does this mean for funding applications?

Should identify and address a genuine problem:

- Have all concerned stakeholders been consulted and engaged?
- Have capacity needs/gaps been assessed?
- What are the priorities? How does proposal fit into national development plans, strategies, etc.?
- What has already been done or is ongoing / planned?
- Where does it make most sense to allocate resources (costs and benefits)?
- Can resources be leveraged from elsewhere (including locally)?



On-going STDF work on SPS and Trade Facilitation

- **Objective**: Enhance understanding among SPS staff and customs about contribution of SPS agencies to trade facilitation
- Identify key needs, opportunities and good practices to support effective engagement of SPS agencies in collaborative border management
- Regional research in Africa, Asia/Pacific and Latin America (IDB) to identify, analyse and document examples
- Publication of three regional reports and one synthesis study
- Organization of global level event in 2013 to present and discuss findings of research work



Other support to SPS decision-makers

- Creation of national SPS coordination mechanisms
- PPPs in support of SPS capacity
- Pilot training / guidelines on project design and formulation (with EIF)
- Multi-Criteria Decision Analysis (MCDA) to rank SPS priorities



Multi-Criteria Decision Analysis - Context

- Wide range of SPS capacity building needs
- Resource constraints and challenges in establishing priorities
- Process of priority-setting often lacks coherence and transparency



MCDA decision support tool

- Structured approach to establish priorities between alternative capacity building options
- Facilitate inputs from diverse (public/private) stakeholders
- Promote transparency and *aid* decision-making

- Evidence to support fund-raising
- Greater resource efficiency
- Enhanced trade and social outcomes and impacts



MCDA decision support tool - steps

- Compilation of "information dossier"
- Stakeholder meeting (e.g. national SPS Committee)
- Identification of SPS capacity options, decision criteria and weights
- Capacity building options ranked based on specific, documented assumptions (using "D-sight" software)
- May be re-ranked based on new data, changed decision criteria/weights, etc.



Ongoing work on MCDA

- Draft MCDA guidebook on STDF website
- Initial applications in Africa in 2011 (Mozambique, Zambia) + regional training workshop
- Additional applications in Belize and COMESA member states + development of regional MCDA "model" (with support USAID).
- Planned application in Viet Nam in September 2012 + regional training workshop for Southeast Asian countries in Bangkok (November 2012)
- Revise and publish final MCDA guidebook



Grants for project development

- Application of capacity evaluation / prioritization tools
- Feasibility studies
- Project formulation
- Grants ≤ US\$50,000
- Synergies with other initiatives
- Mobilizing donor funds





Project grants to improve SPS situation and enhance market access

- Focus on projects that:
- •identify, develop and/or disseminate good practice
- •are linked to topics covered by STDF's work
- •use regional approaches
- •are innovative, collaborative, inter-disciplinary

STDF contribution ≤ US\$1 million, 3 year duration, or less
