Formulating a new CAREC Trade Facilitation Strategic Framework

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CAREC WTO TFA Implementation

- TFA came into force in February 2017
- 8 CAREC countries are WTO members: AFG, PRC, GEO, KAZ, KGZ, MON, PAK, TAJ
- Requirements upon entry into force:
 - National Committee on Trade Facilitation (NCTF) ør similar mechanism in place
 - 2. Notify WTO of Category A designations and implement them Category B and C designations with dates of implementation;
 - Category C will include information on technical assistance and capacity building required to implement

New CAREC 2030 Strategy

- June 2017 SOM broadly endorsed the overall directions, operational priorities and institutional arrangements of new strategy; further discussions at NFP meeting prior to endorsement at 16th MC
- Proposed Mission Statement: "A Regional Cooperation Platform to Connect People, Policies and Projects for Shared and Sustainable Development"
- 5 operational clusters
 - economic and financial stability;
 - trade, investment, economic corridors and tourism;
 - infrastructure and economic connectivity;
 - agriculture and water; and
 - social services.



New Institutional Arrangements

- Appropriate institutional arrangements to operationalize 5 operational clusters but keep CAREC's institutional structure simple, effective and efficient
- Ministerial Conference to serve as a high-level policy development forum
- Sector committees play important role and should be further strengthened and rationalized
- Proposal to merge trade policy and trade facilitation under a unified trade cluster; solicit views from related sector committees on the proposal



Trade Facilitation Sector

SOM endorsed/acknowledged:

- need to support member countries meet their TFA related commitments; assessment of the TFA implementation status in CAREC countries
- pilot initiatives of CAREC Advanced Transit System and noted the need to develop a legal framework and arrangement to regulate electronic data exchange
- Agenda for Modernization of Sanitary and Phytosanitary Measures and standards for trade and instructed to undertake concrete actions on this agenda including building quality management infrastructure
 - role of private sector SMEs in regional value chains, participation in cross-border infra and logistics projects



New Trade Facilitation Strategic Framework

- New strategic framework, consistent with the new forthcoming CAREC Strategy 2030 and supports TFA implementation
 - Continue and deepen the existing areas of competence such as in customs and selected areas of integrated trade facilitation
 - Adopt and implement the latest global agenda on trade facilitation, i.e., WTO TFA
 - Reach out to related existing and new sectoral, cross-sectoral and broader policy areas where trade facilitation plays key roles, such as transport, agriculture, SME development, cross-border finance, cross-border economic zone, regional and global value chain, and ecommerce, etc;
 - Evaluate results objectively and continuously and strengthen implementation and adjust the program accordingly
 - Crush institutional silos for seamless exchange of information and effective coordination
