Aligning Customs Trade Facilitation Measures with Best Practices

Workshops

- Sharing RKC Accession Experiences countries in the process of accession prepared action plans to complete documentation; countries who have acceded prepared plans to improve compliance
- RKC Situation/Gap Analysis in UZB refined action plan identified changes to rules and laws necessary to complete accession document
- AEO Program Implementation workshops to assist AZE, KAZ, MON to better implement or start up their AEO program

Aligning Customs Trade Facilitation Measures with Best Practices

- 2 Assessment: Customs Risk Management (CRM)
 - Assessment workshops and trainings on risk management for KAZ, UZB,
 TAJ
 - Conformity to international standards as basis for assessment
 - Existing CRMs needs to be updated including possible introduction of AEO program
- 3 Framework for Customs Information Exchange Mechanism
 - Readiness and Maturity Assessment initial report
 - Information Exchange Framework to be designed based on assessment results

Coordinated Border Management

1 TRS National Planning Workshops

- Customs personnel MON, KAZ, KGZ trained by WCO on how to use the WCO TRS Online software
- Action plans prepared to implement TRS in select BCPs

2 Complementary use of CPMM/TRS data

- Consultants fielded to assess implementation of TRS; initial results showed complexity of implementation, need for hands on training, and poor use of CPMM data by customs
- Regional TRS and CPMM Workshop (Urumqi, 17–18 May 2016) assessment findings to be presented; training on how to best use the 2 methodologies: TRS and CPMM; need to involve local research agencies to conduct national level analysis of CPMM data

3 Case Study: MON-PRC JCC Pilot Project

- Case study identified positive factors that influenced success of JCC pilot; identified problems encountered; recommendations to improve implementation
- Next steps:
 - Zamyn Uud-Erlian and Gashuun Sukhait-Ganqimaodao to use e-UCM and move towards Phase 2 implementation
 - Pilot to be extended to other MON-PRC BCP pairs—Manlaa [Mandula] and Hangii ports
 - Other CAREC countries to initiate pilots

4 Complementary Study: Immigration Authorities Readiness

- Need to facilitate movement of people not only goods; particularly business and transport people
- Initial report on movement of people along MON-PRC borders, with IOM support
- CAREC-wide visa scheme, ADB in-house review

 WCO to conduct initial training for MON customs, immigration and SPS agencies on May 2016

SPS Measures

- 1 SPS assessment on regulatory, laboratory, and border services conducted for all CAREC countries in 2014–2015
 - An initial study assessed the application of SPS measures in 5 CAREC countries (MON, KAZ, KGZ, UZB, PRC).
 Findings were presented at the Bangkok SPS Workshop in 25–26 Jul 2012.
- 2 Report validation workshop (Kyrgyz Republic, Jan 2015)

- 3 CAREC Common Agenda for Modernization of SPS Measures endorsed by MC in September 2015
- 4 Mongolia: Regional Upgrades of Sanitary and Phytosanitary Measures for Trade Project - loan signed December 2015; now effective
- 5 Regional Upgrade of SPS Measures for Trade (RUST) - for other CAREC countries

CCC Resolutions, 2015


- 1. Strengthen risk management; adopt SAFE framework
- 2. Expand JCC to other CAREC BCPs
- 3. Pilot customs information exchange mechanism
- 4. Pilot regional transit regime
- Maximize CPMM and TRS data to identify BCP bottlenecks
- 6. Improve coordination among border control agencies
- 7. Increase cooperation between CCC and CFCFA

CFCFA takes bigger TF Roles



- 1. Provide risk data on traders, carriers and forwarders (AEO)
- Partner with customs to standardize procedures
- Encourage carriers and forwarders to participate in regional transit
- 4. Better communication channel between private sector and customs
- 5. With customs, conduct capacity building and research

- √ Collects data for the CPMM
- √ Regional Logistics Training Program (KGZ, Dec 2014)
- √ Short Course in Trade Logistics for carriers and forwarders (TKM, Jun 2015)

Key Issues presented to SOM, 2015

- 1 Inter-agency coordination through NJC or TFC
 - Only PAK has a functioning NJC
 - KGZ establishing a TFC
- 2 Coordination between TF bodies and TPSAP
- **3** Regional Transit System
 - Regional guarantee system
 - Comprehensive insurance backup
 - Regulatory framework
- 4 SPS Reform and Modernization

- 2. Meetings between CCC/CFCFA/TPSAP
- 3. Support for establishing TFC
- 4. Develop RIBS/RUST projects in more countries
