

TTFS 2020: Priority Projects and TAs

- Priority Investment Program: 108 projects with an estimated cost of \$40.8B
- 76 new projects combined with 32 ongoing, composed of:
 - 49 road projects and 24 railway projects
 - 19 airport, port, and LC projects
 - 16 trade facilitation projects, out of which 6 are of regional focus
- 49 TA projects with an estimated cost of \$75.8M




