

PROMOTING COOPERATION IN SANITARY AND PHYTOSANITARY (SPS) MEASURES FOR CAREC


Background

- All countries maintain SPS measures to ensure food safety and prevent spread of plant/animal diseases.
- However, poorly designed SPS measures can harm competitiveness and constrain trade in the CAREC region.
- World Trade Organization SPS Agreement considered as international best practice

CAREC SPS Workshop (July 2012)

– focused on information
exchange and initial steps to
develop an SPS action plan for
regional cooperation to improve
SPS measures in CAREC





CAREC SPS Publication (May 2013) – highlighted key findings on country-level assessments and emerging SPS-related issues in CAREC and identified coordinated efforts and investments needed.

Key Issues

- Regulatory framework for SPS in CAREC countries not fully consistent with international best practice.
- SPS laboratory infrastructure need to be upgraded and modernized.
- Coordination at the border between SPS agencies and customs needs to be improved.

PROJECT OBJECTIVES

- Promote SPS reforms and modernization consistent with international standards in a way that advances trade facilitation.
- Identify and prioritize investment needs to modernize SPS measures and their application
 - Regional project: Regional Upgrade of SPS standards for Trade (RUST)

PROJECT COMPONENTS AND KEY ACTIVITIES

Review of regulatory framework

- Identify SPS regulations and procedures that constitute a barrier.
- Analyze gaps between SPS agreement (international standards) and existing regulatory framework in each country.
- > Recommend harmonization of selected regulations.

Inventory of laboratory assets

- ➤ List SPS laboratory infrastructure required to ensure safety of food and health animals/plants.
- >Identify critical investments needed to modernize and upgrade laboratories.

Border Management Strategy

- >Assess current border management regulations.
- >Identify key BCPs for priority handling of goods subject to SPS control.
- Recommendations for effective SPS border management in coordination with other agencies.
