## **SME Development as Impetus to Economic Growth**

SME is the backbone of private sector, which drives the engine of economic growth. SME also creates most jobs. Thus, support and fostering SME is a key policy issue for governments worldwide, including Central Asia.

How to create an enabling environment and policy and regulatory framework conducive to SME is a challenge. SME vary by types, with equally diverse needs. Understanding their needs is a prerequisite for a favourable policy framework. Financing SME remains a policy challenge in all countries, and making financing accessible and affordable to SME must be a part and parcel of the policy package. CAREC countries also face economic diversification issue. In this process, SME plays a key role. Economy wide and sector specific policies and regulations will need to be carefully examined, formulated and executed in bringing out the full potential of SME to benefit the economy.

Many countries have accumulated rich experiences in SME development. Learning from and exchanging experience with each other would benefit all, and for CAREC countries, would smoothen the sharp learning curve.

## **Purpose and Format of the Workshop**

The Workshop would focus on public sector support for SME development with systematic analysis of both the demand and supply side, and the policy support framework will be applied to participants own country settings. Throughout the success experience of the Singapore government will be referenced. The workshop will be conducted through a combination of: (i) expert presentations; (ii) sharing of good/best case experiences from the countries of the participants, including presentations by the participants; and (iii) field visit to Suzhou Industrial Park.
