# Customers' Experiences Using Rail Transport

Complex tariff structure

Difficulties dealing with railway organizations

Difficult to track shipment

Need to get railway "codes"

Typically from "railway" forwarder

Absence of "expedited rail services



Procedures so complex, many users choose road transport

## Three Primary Issues:

**Tariff Administration** 

Wagon Tracking

Need for Expedited Rail Services

#### **Tariff Administration**

Railway "codes" need to be more easily obtained

Bi lateral/multi lateral tariff agreements would help

Transit tariffs often very high

i.e., purchased on line or directly from railway

## Wagon Tracking

Existing tracking systems go through Moscow

Technology may be able to develop more user-friendly system

Shipment tracking critical for most customers

Example: on – line systems


### **Need for Expedited Rail Services**
