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Background

- SPS measures ensure food safety and prevent spread of plant/animal diseases.
- Poorly designed SPS measures can harm competitiveness and constrain trade.
- WTO SPS Agreement considered as international best practice.

Key Issues

- Regulatory framework for SPS in CAREC countries not consistent with international best practice.
- SPS laboratory infrastructure need to be upgraded and modernized.
- Coordination at the border between SPS agencies and customs needs to be improved.



TA OBJECTIVES

Promote SPS reforms and modernization consistent with international standards.

 Identify and prioritize investment needs to modernize SPS measures and their application

PROJECT COMPONENTS AND KEY ACTIVITIES

Review of regulatory framework

- > Identify SPS regulations and procedures that contribute most to trade facilitation.
- >Analyze gaps between SPS agreement (international standards) and existing regulatory framework in each country.
- > Recommend harmonization of selected regulations.

Inventory of laboratory assets

- >Assess SPS laboratory infrastructure in CAREC countries.
- ➤ Identify critical investments needed to modernize and upgrade laboratories.

Border Management Strategy

- Evaluate relations among SPS and other border agencies.
- Identify key BCPs for priority handling of goods subject to SPS control.
- Evaluate use of technology for SPS control and to link SPS agency systems with Customs and single windows.

Key Tasks

- Regulatory assessment
 - Assess if, and which, legislation and technical requirements to import food, animals and plants constitute a barrier
 - Is the type, frequency, and method of control appropriate to the risk
 - If legislation and enforcement mechanisms meet international standards on paper, to what extent are they implemented/practiced

Key Tasks

- Laboratory capacity assessment
 - List of equipment and infrastructure required to ensure safety of food and health of animals and plants.
 - Determine how much of required equipment and infrastructure are in place.
 - Investment plan to upgrade SPS facilities.

Key Tasks

- SPS border services management assessment
 - Establish key elements of SPS border management strategy.
 - Assess current border control and border management regulations.
 - Recommendations for effective SPS border management strategy particularly coordination with other agencies.

Work Completed

- Consulting team has conducted field visits and consulted with CAREC SPS authorities.
- Questionnaires distributed, collected, and analyzed.
- Draft report
- Concluding workshop to present findings and recommendations and solicit feedback from participants
- Revision of report to integrate comments
- Final report delivered
- CAREC Common Agenda for SPS Modernization drafted

Common Agenda for SPS Modernization

- Harmonization
- Eliminate non-tariff barriers to trade
- Expand market access
- Guide and support SPS modernization

Work Underway

- "Regional Upgrades of SPS measures for Trade (RUST)" project being designed for Mongolia
- Dialogue initiated with other CAREC countries and development partners to respond to requests for assistance in designing and implementing reforms and investing in SPS facilities.

Next Steps

- CAREC to adopt and begin to implement Common Agenda
- SPS agencies in CAREC countries to develop SPS modernization strategies and discuss their implementation needs (investment and technical assistance) with Ministries of Finance
- Development partners to coordinate responses to demand for assistance
