Background

CAREC countries are working together to implement the refined Transport and Trade Facilitation Strategy (TTFS) 2020. TTFS 2020 continues to prioritize the completion of the six strategic multimodal transport corridors, and introduced extensions to these.

Objectives

The TSCC will review the implementation progress of the CAREC TTFS 2020 and the Transport Sector Work Plan (2015-2017); and discuss issues of key importance to the transport sector including railways, road safety, asset management and transport facilitation. It will provide necessary direction to the ongoing preparation of the draft Railway Strategy and Road Safety Strategy. It will also discuss the work of the TSCC in the context of a rapidly changing world.
