## **Background**

Over the past 20 years, economies in most Central Asian Regional Economic Cooperation (CAREC) member countries have changed dramatically. However, railway operations and institutions have not kept pace with these changes. As a result, CAREC railways are experiencing decreases in market share and are in need of both investments in physical capacity and in institutional restructuring. Unless strong measures are taken to reverse this trend, the future will be a continuation of losing market share and a weakening of the railway sector. Recognizing these challenges, CAREC countries have decided to develop a strategy that will serve as a blueprint for addressing challenges and maximize the contribution of railways to sustained economic growth. Following decisions at the 14th CAREC Transport Sector Coordinating Committee meeting in April 2015, a Railway Working Group was formed in order to guide the development of this strategy. The first meeting of the RWG took place in Tokyo Japan in November 2015, which (i) shared the main issues facing railways in the CAREC region, (ii) reviewed progress toward development of the CAREC railway strategy and (iii) agreed on priority actions moving forward for the full development of the strategy.

# Objectives of the Second Meeting of the RWG

The main objective of the Second Meeting of the RWG is to discuss and agree on key actions to achieve the goal of the strategy. The output of the meeting will be the overall action plan, which will be indicated in the results-based framework of the CAREC railway strategy, for subsequent endorsement by the 15<sup>th</sup> TSCC (scheduled for 20-22 April 2016, immediately following the Second Meeting of the RWG). To this effect, the Meeting will receive further inputs from CAREC member countries and development partners on the draft CAREC railway strategy.
