

Background of ASEAN NCAP: 2007

- Inception of Malaysian Institute of Road Safety Research (MIROS) through the Road Safety Plan 2006–2010
- The idea to have an automobile safety rating with interim name Malaysian NCAP or MyNCAP.
- Inception of a unit dedicated to realize MyNCAP: Crash Safety Engineering Unit (CRASE).


Background of ASEAN NCAP: 2009

- Formation of soft landing program – Malaysian Vehicle Assessment Programme (MyVAP).
- Non-destructive assessment of vehicle—use of secondary data from the OEMs to assess the safety level of vehicles.
- Focus: Malaysian manufacturers.
- Why soft landing?
 - As introduction to OEMs of the upcoming NCAP in Malaysian market.



Background of ASEAN NCAP: 2010

- Series of crash tests performed as a start-up to MyNCAP.
 - To increase our capacity and technical capability on performing full scale crash test.
- 2010: Motorcycle crash test.
 - Gravity propelled
- 2010: First passenger car crash test.
 - Car vs. Trailer (RUPD assessment)



Background of ASEAN NCAP: 2011

- 2011: Car-to-car outdoor crash test.
 - Aged vs. new
- 2011: Motorcycle Anthropomorphic Test Device (MATD) crash test.
 - Assessment on car airbag retrofitted into motorcycle
- June 2011: Proposal to Global NCAP during the NCAP Meeting in conjunction with 22nd Enhanced Safety of Vehicle (ESC) Conference in Washington, USA (June 2011).

Formation of ASEAN NCAP

December 2011: MoU Signing between Global NCAP and MIROS in New Delhi.

Global Plan for Decade of Action for Road Safety 2011-2020

The Decade was approved by the Moscow Ministerial in 2009 and UN General Assembly in 2010. It was launched by a global relay of events on 11th May. A Plan for the Decade has been prepared based on five pillars:

1. Building Management Capacity
2. Encouraging Safer User Behaviour
- 3. Building Safer Vehicles**
4. Building Safer Roads
5. Improving Post Crash Care



Each pillar includes indicative and interim targets to progress towards the Decade's overall goal which is to 'stabilize and then reduce the level of road fatalities'. This requires a 50% reduction in the forecast level of fatalities by 2020 which could avoid 5 million deaths, 50 million injuries and save \$3 trillion in social costs.

Pillar 3: Safer vehicles

Encourage universal deployment of improved vehicle safety technologies for both passive and active safety through a combination of harmonization of relevant global standards, consumer information schemes and incentives to accelerate the uptake of new technologies.

Activity 1: Encourage Member States to apply and promulgate motor vehicle safety regulations as developed by the United Nation's World Forum for the Harmonization of Vehicle Regulations (WP 29).

Activity 2: Encourage implementation of new car assessment programmes in all regions of the world in order to increase the availability of consumer information about the safety performance of motor vehicles.

Activity 3: Encourage agreement to ensure that all new motor vehicles are equipped with seat-belts and anchorages that meet regulatory requirements and pass applicable crash test standards (as minimum safety features).


Activity 4: Encourage universal deployment of crash avoidance technologies with proven effectiveness such as Electronic Stability Control and Anti-Lock Braking Systems in motorcycles.

Activity 5: Encourage the use of fiscal and other incentives for motor vehicles that provide high levels of road user protection and discourage import and export of new or used cars that have reduced safety standards.

Activity 6: Encourage application of pedestrian protection regulations and increased research into safety technologies designed to reduce risks to vulnerable road users.

Activity 7: Encourage managers of governments and private sector fleets to purchase, operate and maintain vehicles that offer advanced safety technologies and high levels of occupant protection.



ASEAN NCAP has released the test report of the latest Toyota Hilux, the newest model of Asian number one vehicle.

The new Hilux is already listing the sales chart in Thailand and will soon be launched in Malaysia. The highest variant gets seven airbags, ESC and seatbelt reminders for both front occupants, among others.

It is then not a surprise that the new Hilux scored a full five rating for AOP and Adult COP.

During the ASEAN Automotive Safety Forum in Bandung happening currently right now from 29 - 30 September at Institut Teknologi Bandung, ASEAN NCAP has released a few more crash test results - this time around targeting cars for the Indonesian market.



Datsun Go, among the most affordable cars in Indonesia has received a 5-star rating in the Adult Occupant Protection (AOP) and 5-star rating for the Child Occupant Protection (COP). The test results came with single airbag, no seatbelt reminder or Electronic Stability Control (ESC).

According to Khairil Anuar Abd Razak, Secretary general for ASEAN NCAP, the Go was tested before by Global NCAP and the previous result was a 4-star rating. Razak has improved on the Go's body structure and added an airbag, making it a safer car than before.

If you're holding out for the arrival of the Honda BR-V, here's an important update about the crossover in regards to its safety. Today, the ASEAN NCAP has released its testing results for the BR-V, and it's good news for prospective buyers.

That's right, the crossover, which comes in seven- and five-seater configurations (depending on markets), managed to obtain a five-star rating, scoring 14.79 points out of a possible 16 in the Adult Occupant Protection (AOP). Meanwhile, the BR-V managed a 72% compliance in Child Occupant Protection (COP).

However, due to the ASEAN NCAP five-star requirements, where Electronic Stability Control (ESC) is required to receive said rating, the crossover will receive two ratings depending on the variant specified.

Local carmaker to get show-cause letter

> Asean NCAP probing alleged removal of child safety protection system in one of its models

PETALING JAYA: The safety rating awarded to the car carrier model by Asean NCAP (New Car Assessment Programme) has been scrutinised after it allegedly removed a child safety protection system in one of its

models last year.

It is reliably learnt that Asean NCAP is currently investigating and may propose a new review whether to suspend the 5-star rating or to make changes to the model or to retest the latest version of the car. It also learnt that the regional vehicle safety watchdog is furious with the company after

receiving complaints from car buyers that it failed to incorporate the new generation model offered under the programme.

"It is true, this is a serious violation of the car buyer rights as well as undermining the protection for child on board," said the source.

It is also learned that Asean NCAP has issued a "show cause letter" to the company this week, and the safety body may undertake a thorough audit

exercise for it to take other measures if it has not been addressing safety star-rating under the programme.

The car model received 59% marks for the child safety protection (COP) category due to the presence of top tether and was given a 5-star rating based on its safety specifications for adult occupant protection (AOP) which include seat belt reminder (for driver only) and airbag.

Single star rating to override dual rating system

This was outlined in the Asean NCAP (New Car Assessment Programme) 2007-2010 road map presented at the 2010 Asean participants of the International Conference on Southeast Asia's Development of Road Safety, Safer Vehicles and Asian Action Plan (ASAP) forum held in Bandung, Indonesia recently.

Asean NCAP secretary-general Kuan Hock Ang said the SAT will contribute 25% of the overall target of the Asean action plan to the next 12 months.

The road map towards 2020 also introduces a single star rating system and eliminates the dual rating system to encourage manufacturers for consumers due to clever marketing ploys, he said.

"We found that the dual rating system has been manipulated by some manufacturers through advertisements," Kuan Hock Ang told *THE STAR*.

"For example, a car model which receives a five-star rating when marketed as a five-star, which was actually awarded for a different variant of the car," he explained.

To overcome the confusion, he said, only the lowest variant of a particular car model from within the range will receive a rating from 2010 onwards.

"It will be 50 cents for adult occupancy protection (AOP) and 25 cents for child safety protection (COP) to ensure a car model receives the highest star award and also provide incentives for the safety of the child inside a car," he said.

Ang said the road map recognises in changing the landscape of automotive safety in the region by focusing on the following areas:

Kuan said that the new road map will be implemented in this programme which was introduced three years ago.

Under the regional automobile safety body outlines (SAT), a car model that carries a passenger car, he added: "Crash avoidance and mitigation."

"This reflects our effort to put pressure on the car manufacturers to manufacture more features and produce safer cars."

TEKS1M hails fare

KUALA LUMPUR: Malaysia Taxi (TEKS1M) drivers yesterday welcomed the move by the Land Public Transport Commission (SLPTC) to increase fares would be reduced by year-end.

TEKS1M driver, Wong Chee Chan, 52, said the drivers were shocked by what he heard and hoped it can bring about a better relationship towards the service.

Many consumers avoid using TEKS1M because the fares are expensive and I believe the new fares, which are lower than the current rate, will encourage them to use this taxi service," he said.

Wong, who has a TEKS1M driver for two years, said in Kuala Lumpur, the fare for a 10-minute trip from RMS with no set per hour, "was RM10.50 but now it is RM8.50. I formally heard RM8 per hour," he said.

Soon Mohandy, SLPTC chairman Tan Sri Syed Hishamuddin Syed Hassan, said the fare rates for TEKS1M would be reduced by year-end to encourage more people to use the service. — Bernama

Selangor wants PKNS, KPS to explain toll hikes

PETALING JAYA: The Selangor State Development Corporation (PKNS) and Kumpulan Perusahaan Selangor (KPS) will be hauled up to explain the toll hikes on major highways.

Selangor Menteri Besar Mohamed Azmin Ali said on Tuesday that the state government will be calling the two state-owned companies to account for any relevant stakeholders in the Kesan and Lebuhraya Damansara-Puchong (LDP) and the Selangor State Economic Action Council (SEAC) to probe the toll hikes.

"We have asked PKNS and KPS. Parangam, which will have minutes to meet with us and LDP, to attend METES tomorrow (today) to explain the toll hikes as many of the toll stations at major highways in the Kesan and LDP, and now to Syed Putra, will be closed through Kumpulan Parangam.

"It is unacceptable that toll rates at 12 major highways in the Klang Valley are still on the rise from RM4.70 to today.

Meanwhile, sacked Umno member Amnah Asadi said

the government could have used revenue from the Goods and Services Tax (GST) to offset the increase in the highway concessions, he said.

A non-governmental organisation, Pertubuhan Kemajuan dan Kesejahteraan Melayu (MJMM), yesterday

lodged a police report over the toll hikes.

Its president, Abdul Rani Kulup Abdullah, said the report had been filed at Dang Wangi police station is to urge the government and highway concessionaires to postpone the toll hikes.

"The government and toll companies should do it themselves. Once they do it, we will be satisfied," Rani Kulup told reporters.

MJMM urged the government to define the situation. Don't increase the rates for now, so people are not pressurised," he added.

MH17 families continue to cry out for justice

PUTRAJAYA: Malaysia families of those killed in the Malaysia Airlines Flight 370 (MH370) will not be satisfied until justice is served.

Spokesperson for the families, Jigar Singh, said the perpetrators who killed all 239 passengers and crew on board still have not been identified and the families want the results of the investigation to be expected.

"They will be satisfied only in the terms with it, we expect that. This is the way we are thinking who the perpetrator is," he said.

"Russia and Ukraine are both blaming each other. We still do not know who are

the culprits and most families are not too happy about the fact that they did not know what happened to their loved ones," he said.

The attorney general has confirmed that it was a Russian-made BUK surface-to-air missile that brought down the plane over the war-torn region of Donetsk in eastern Ukraine. The plane was flying back to Kuala Lumpur from Amsterdam on July 17, 2014.

He said the families are taking responsibility for not closing the case, as it is the right of a civil war.

Malaysia Minister of Home Affairs Muhyiddin Yassin said she is satisfied with how the government is handling the matter as far as he is concerned that

the culprits have not been identified more than a year after the tragedy. "We are still investigating, but we also want to see those responsible face the heat for this terrible crime. How long do more we need to wait?" he said.

He said the families understand that it is not a simple nor easy task to find the culprits. "We have done our best so those responsible will not get off scot-free," he said.

He said the families believed that their family is thankful that the government remains so that the case could be closed.

Captain's brother, Don Shabrial Shamsudin, and the result of the investigation are nothing new

and the family would prefer to know who did it and what will be done to those responsible.

They are going to never settle until justice is done. We have to wait for the court to decide who shot down the plane, and whenever it should be held responsible," he said.

He said the families wanted to know the reason, the time and place of the incident. Action what will the whole world take after the final verdict," he added.

He also pointed out that the families' names have not been released despite an announcement by the authorities that it would be done a year after the incident.
