### Results achieved in the transport sector

## Total 60 investment projects \$2 billion:

- putting into operation more than 2,200 km of highways of international importance;
- 237 large and small bridges;
- 219 km of railway tracks;
- more than 31 km of tunnels;
- 22 avalanche galleries with a length of 3.5 km.

# Transport Communication and Road Network Development

Currently, the Republic of Tajikistan has identified priority trade and transit corridors traversing our territory from east to west, from north to south and which are of international importance:

- within 4 CAREC corridors (CAREC #2, #3, #5, #6)
- within the 3rd corridor of the Asian Highways (AN-7, AN-65, AN-66),
- within the transport corridor Europe-Caucasus-Asia TRACECA: 2 corridors T-23 and T-34 .

In the future, it is planned to attract about 6.3 billion US dollars for transport infrastructure development, including transport and transit corridors, in order to implement new projects that will contribute to a significant change in the pattern and structure of international cargo flows, integration efficiency and economic growth.

#### BRIEFLY ABOUT RAILWAYS OF THE REPUBLIC OF TAJIKISTAN

Currently the railway network of the Republic of Tajikistan is 974.8 km, of which 680.5 km are main tracks, 80.3 km are access tracks, and 214 km are station tracks.

#### The Tajik railway consists of three sections:


- ➤ Northern corridor: Istiklol Bekabad, 109 km
- > Central corridor: Vahdat Pakhtaobod , 89 km
- > Southern corridor: Kulob Khoshadi , 296 km

#### The Tajik Railway owns

- > 1,976 freight cars
- > 400 passenger cars
- **>** 43 locomotives
- > Track width is 1,520 mm.

100% of traction is provided by diesel locomotives.
