- Bilateral air services agreements signed with 39 countries
- Common Aviation Area Agreement signed with EU and its member states
- Air services agreements planned with 10 countries

Maritime Transport

- Bilateral intergovernmental agreements signed with 16 countries
- Planned with 4 countries

Road Transport

- Bilateral intergovernmental agreements signed with 30 countries
- Planned with 3 countries including China

Road Safety

- National Road Safety Strategy was adopted in 2016
- 6 state agencies share the responsibility for road safety in the country. Ministry of Economy and Sustainable Development of Georgia was defined as a lead agency
- Inter-Agency Commission and National Working Group of Road Safety were created
- Focus is on ensuring safe vehicle, safe infrastructure, safe road users, effective enforcement and post-crash response and better road safety data base
- International platforms are actively used for stronger cooperation on road safety (CAREC, EU, UN, etc.)

National Road Safety Strategy of Georgia










TEN-T extension to the EaP region



- Georgia is strengthening its role in bridging Europe and Asia
- Extension of the Trans-European Transport Network (TEN-T) to Georgia and other EaP partner countries entered into force in January 2019
- EaP Investment Action Plan was published in 2019
- 18 priority projects identified for Georgia, with total investment of 3.14 bln€


