# Updates on CAREC Trade Facilitation Program 2015–2016 and Outcomes of CAREC Senior Officials Meeting

15<sup>th</sup> Customs Cooperation Committee Meeting Singapore 21 September 2016



- 1. Customs Cooperation
  - a. Reforms in regulatory frameworks to comply with best practices
    - TAJ has acceded to RKC
    - UZB approved new Customs Code compliant with RKC
    - AZE issued decrees and orders to facilitate border crossing
    - MON agreement with RF and PRC on mutual recognition of custom control
  - b. Modernization/automation of customs processes
    - AZE, MON, and UZB have introduced electronic/online declaration of goods
    - TAJ and AFG electronic exchange of customs data
    - Customs participated in assessment on readiness and maturity to exchange customs information

- c. Improved risk management systems
  - AZE started using automated risk management in Aug 2016; staff had training on risk analysis, review of x-ray images
  - MON updated control selectivity module
  - UZB approved regulation on risk management, created working group to develop rules and supervise implementation

#### d. Joint Customs Control

- MON & PRC working on electronic unified cargo manifest
- e. Regional transit
  - CAREC customs cooperated with consultants on design of regional transit guarantee mechanism

- 2. Integrated Trade Facilitation
  - a. Common Agenda for Modernization of SPS
    - Regional Upgrades of SPS Measures for Trade (RUST) in Mongolia
  - b. Regional Improvement of Border Services (RIBS)
    - RIBS in Kyrgyz Republic, Mongolia, Pakistan, Tajikistan
  - c. More extensive private sector participation
    - CFCFA participation in regional transit, adoption of FIATA standards to local situation, develop liability insurance for freight forwarders and risk-based regional transit insurance products.





- d. Strengthening of Monitoring, Data Analysis, and Policy Planning
  - Complementary use of TRS and CPMM tools to improve results management
  - CFCFA: developed an information platform for cross border freight services
- e. Revive plans to establish/strengthen National Trade Facilitation Committees
  - improve cross-sector and cross-country coordination and private sector participation

### Key issues presented to the SOM

- CCC to pilot regional transit guarantee mechanism and electronic customs information exchange mechanism
- 2. CFCFA to contribute to customs risk management and play a key role in regional transit guarantee mechanism
- 3. All stakeholders to break institutional barriers by working together in national trade facilitation committees and the CAREC regional TF committee



#### **Outcomes: CAREC Mid-year SOM**

- SOM encourages CCC to:
  - Continue reform efforts
  - Improve regional customs transit
  - Improve information exchange platforms
  - Strengthen partnership with the private sector
  - Participate in planning more investment projects under the RUST and RIBS programs



### **Outcomes: CAREC Mid-year SOM**

- SOM acknowledges the CAREC countries' challenges in fulfilling policy actions pertaining to SPS.
- SOM encourages TPCC collaborate with international development partners: stock taking exercise on SPS measures.
- SOM encourages CAREC countries in providing the required data on TPSAP measures targeted at end-2015.
- SOM welcomes the launching of the regional food safety initiative as another concrete step to implement the SPS common agenda.
