Modernized Sanitary and Phytosanitary Measures—a priority area in CAREC 2030 strategy...





- help member countries in implementing
 WTO SPS agreement
- align SPS measures with international standards
- build capacity to improve product quality and diversity and shipment linkages
- support for transboundary animal disease control
- develop a CAREC food safety network and a common quality control system

...to support integration in global economy.



Common Agenda for Modernization of SPS Measures for Trade

- concerted effort to modernize SPS systems and strengthen cooperation in SPS measures
- integral part of CAREC Integrated Trade Agenda 2030
- complement customs-related trade facilitation measures
- amid pandemic, more relevant to ensure safe trade and increase resilience against transboundary pests and diseases







Common Challenges in CAREC Countries









Plant Health

- Poor understanding of both importing country phytosanitary requirements and pest risks on import goods
- Lack of accurate pest distribution data as basis for regulated pest lists
- Poor access to central laboratories delay sampling and testing
- Electronic phytosanitary certification to be incorporated into single window, etc.

Animal Health

- Lack of animal identification without which zoning of TADs cannot be achieved
- Division of responsibilities among different agencies
- Inadequate secondary legislation

Food Safety

- Legislative base inadequate to make HACCP compulsory
- Moving to riskbased indicators of food safety and correspondence
- Achieving balance between food control and trade facilitation

HACCP = Hazard Analysis Critical Control Point; TADS = Transboundary Animal Diseases




Cooperation Framework to develop medium-

to long-term strategy, deepen regional cooperation, and prepare bankable investment projects for **Agricultural Development and Food Security in the CAREC Region**



TA 9500 Key Performance Indicators

2,151 benefited from knowledge events (2018-2022)



14 regional/subregional and 13 national activities

Survey of CAREC TA participants (November 2022, % of responses)

regional working group contributed to **stronger cooperation** and institutional coordination among stakeholders (88%)

activities **strengthened capacity** for legislation and enforcement of SPS measures (79%)

activities **enhanced compliance** with international SPS requirements to expand market access (76%)

trainings contributed to **streamlining border inspection** and documentary requirements for goods subject to SPS inspection (58%)



TA 9500 Key Performance Indicators

Outcome:

Modernized SPS systems with capacity to ensure food safety, animal and plant health



SPS working groups organized



National SPS measures substantially aligned with international standards



Technical capacities on SPS measures at selected common borders improved
