Different levels of readiness


- All ASEAN Members have ratified the WTO TFA



OECD Trade Facilitation Indicators




- Average implementation score decreased from 1.35 in 2015 to 1.25 in 2017
- Improvements seen in the implementation of <u>advance rulings</u>, <u>fees and charges</u>, and <u>documentary formalities</u>
- Large decreases in scores in <u>information availability</u>, <u>internal</u> <u>cooperation</u>, and <u>appeal procedures</u>



UN Trade Facilitation & Paperless Trade

- Average implementation increased by approximately 5% from 59% in 2015 to 64% in 2017
- Most implemented measure in ASEAN countries is <u>Independent appeal mechanism</u>
- Other measures with high implementation rates include: <u>publication of regulations</u>, <u>acceptance of copies</u>, <u>advance rulings</u>, <u>consultations</u>, <u>risk management</u>, and <u>post-</u> <u>clearance audit</u>
- Least implemented measure is <u>Trade facilitation measures for authorized operators</u> however, the implementation of this measure is still very high (70%)

ASEAN Seamless Trade Facilitation Indicators



- High scores on <u>transparency</u>, <u>information and</u> <u>communication</u> and <u>engagement with private sector</u>
- Low scores on <u>release and clearance formalities</u>, <u>cross</u> <u>border coordination and transit facilitation</u>, <u>transport</u> <u>facilitation</u>, and <u>e-commerce</u>



- Trade transaction costs data will be approximated by <u>release</u> <u>times</u>, <u>dwell times</u>, and <u>time-to-permit-approval</u> data
- Time release studies to be conducted by ASEAN customs
- Will track both movement of goods and documentary compliance
- Baseline survey: 2018; Monitoring survey: 2020
