
CAREC Corridor Implementation Progress, Planned Actions, and Support Needs





Implementation Progress of the TTFS 2020 projects

- MPW Reforms supporting road asset management
 - A new Organizational Structure of MPW
 - MPW 2019-2023 Strategy
 - A road safety audit will be concluded by mid-2019.
- Road Asset Management system (RAMS)
 - 60 percent completed.
 - Fully operational by mid-2019.
- Road Asset Management Project (RAMP)
 - Kabul Jalalabad Road: 50 percent completed
 - Kabul Kandahar Highways: In procurement
 - Expected completion by mid 2019.





Other National Priority Actions, planned for 2018-2020 and beyond 2020

By 2019

- Finalize a Transport Sector Reform Strategy
 - Including functional assessments of border crossings, logistics centers, air transport and rail, in addition to roads.

By 2020

- Develop the road safety functions within MPW.
- Develop policies for road fees & taxes and implement related initiatives


By 2021

- Develop the regulatory and institutional framework, in addition to capacity requirement for PPPs and implementation of pilot projects
- Capacity Development for Climate Change and Disaster Risk
 Management



Other National Priority Actions, planned for 2018-2020 and beyond 2020

- Complete the Ring Road between Qaisar-Laman Section (ADB)
- Complete linkages to CAREC 5 and 6 Corridor Kabul to Jalalabad Road (ADB) to include the East-West and North-South Corridors.
- **Complete** the Kabul Ring Road \$250 million (Saudi Arabia & GoIRA partial funding. An Additional \$ 100 million required)
- **Build a new tunnel at Salang** \$1.2 billion (require donor support)
- Complete the North-South Corridor Kandahar to Mazar \$550 million (require donor support)
- Complete the East-West Corridor Kabul to Herat through the middle of the country reducing travel distance by 25 percent - \$530 million (require donor support)





CAREC Transport Vision for 2030

- Afghanistan is in line with 2030 strategy for improved policy dialogue, sharing of experiences and enhanced regional cooperation that is aligned with National Development Priorities and SDGs.
- Strategic Directions
 - Strengthen Afghanistan's Economic Corridors.
 - Enhance International, national and subnational connectivity & Access: roads and rails
 - Mitigate congestions near major urban centers
 - Ensure Adequate O&M



CAREC Transport Vision for 2030 -CAREC Building Sustainable Transport Sector

Build Sustainable Institutional Capacity

- Sector wide regulatory framework in line with international regulatory requirement,
- sector wide restructuring,
- building and automating specialized systems, and
- specialized training and skill development for all new systems.

Improve sector financing

enhancing government revenues or expanding funding envelop through partnership with the private sector



CAREC Transport Vision for 2030 -CAREC Building Sustainable Transport Sector

- Climate Change and Disaster Risk Management
 - Enhance resilience by adopting national climate change mitigation policies and implementation of initiatives to mitigate impact of climate change at the major urban centers.
- Strengthen Regional Integration
 - Multi-modal transport including rail, roads pipelines.
 - Ensure that the essential East-West and North-South Corridors are included as part of the CAREC corridors.
 - Enhance border-crossing operations.
 - Develop logistic centers to support trade with neighboring countries.
