Introductory Note

Introduction

- CAREC 2030: Connecting the Region for Shared and Sustainable Development¹ is the strategic framework for the Central Asia Regional Economic Cooperation (CAREC) Program leading to 2030. Endorsed by the 16th Ministerial Conference (MC) in Dushanbe in 2017, it builds on the gains achieved under CAREC 2020.² It is aligned with national strategies and development plans, international sustainable development goals (SDGs), and the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (COP21) global climate agreement.
- 2. An indicative results framework was included in the CAREC 2030. However, specific indicators were left open for the sector coordinating committees and technical groups to deliberate upon and further develop. In the interim, a number of sector strategies with accompanying results frameworks were produced, notably, the CAREC Integrated Trade Agenda³ approved in 2018; the 2030 Transport Strategy⁴ and the 2030 Energy Strategy,⁵ both approved in 2019; and tourism and gender strategies that will be placed to the CAREC Ministers this year. Scoping Studies have been completed for health⁶ and education⁷ while one is underway for CAREC's water pillar. Sector strategies,

operational plans (including for the Food Safety Network under the agriculture pillar), and results frameworks for these sectors and pillars are also being formulated.

3. This draft CAREC 2030 Program Results Framework (PRF), including concrete indicators, baseline data, and data sources at outcome and output levels, is prepared by the CAREC secretariat in coordination with ADB sector focal points. It is being shared for feedback and guidance by the member countries and sector committees and working groups before finalization and adoption for reporting in CAREC's three-yearly Development Effectiveness Report (DEfR).

Development of the CAREC 2030 Program Results Framework

4. The proposed PRF covers the five priority clusters namely, Economic and Financial Stability; Trade, Tourism, and Economic Corridors; Infrastructure and Economic Connectivity; Agriculture and Water; and Human Development. The three cross-cutting themes – Information and Communication Technology (ICT), mitigation of climate change impact, and gender mainstreaming will be tracked as part of the clusters within the various sector and pillar frameworks.

5. The Secretariat focal for each sector or pillar led the identification and screening of indicators, baselines, and targets. The formulation of PRF reflects CAREC's character as an open and inclusive platform and draws inputs from various groups that comprise its new institutional framework. It is in this spirit that the PRF is being shared with the governments, through the National Focal Points for their review. The PRF is also being shared with CAREC's other international development partners for their review and improvement. It will be formally presented to the Senior Officials Meeting for discussion (proposed for mid-October 2020) and final submission to the Ministerial Conference (proposed in the second half of November, 2020) for adoption.

Principles and Criteria for Indicator Selection

6. Indicators have been selected to reflect progress in key areas of the sector or pillar. In the interest of efficiency and brevity, only lead indicators will be reported in the DEfR while the sector coordinating committees and working groups track and report annually on the full spectrum of indicators across their programs. The PRF uses "SMART" (Specific, Measurable, Attainable, Relevant, and Time-Bound) indicators chosen for their robustness in capturing changes to which interventions have contributed over time and relevance towards improving performance and capturing multi-country benefits.

- 7. Overall, indicators must directly measure results, include baselines for each performance dimension, and be supported by regular data collection and reporting. The PRF is flexible to accommodate future indicators and refinements as the sector and cluster programs evolve. The sector and pillar strategies and workplans that are still being formulated will be incorporated into the PRF after being confirmed by sector coordinating committees and working groups.
- 8. The PRF, in view of the above, is a living document that will adopt evolving strategies and approaches as CAREC clusters and sectors respond to the changing needs of the region. Cross-cutting areas such as Economic Corridor Development (ECD) and Tourism are more closely tied to progress in other clusters and sectors. In these cases, ECD and Tourism results will be limited to those aspects over which each program has the most relevance.

Maintenance and Reporting

9. CAREC 2030 mandates the Secretariat to report on the Program's progress every three years and to make these available online. This will be supported with an online system of tracking and updating. A Development Effectiveness Review (DEfR) which reports on progress against the PRF will be prepared in 2021 to reflect results as of 2020 using 2017⁸ data as baseline. The DEfR will be posted on the CAREC website and disseminated widely. This will be in addition to the annual sector progress reports for the Senior Officials Meeting and the Ministerial Conference. The DEFR 2021 will submitted for review by SOM in June 2021 and endorsement by the Ministerial Conference in November 2021. Thereafter, the next DEfR will be prepared in 2024 and subsequently on a three-year basis.
