REVIEWS CAREC'S OPERATI ONS AND ENGAGE MENT

No formal independent evaluation available (contrast: GMS Program)

An informal review (Brookings 2008), a formal Mid-term Review (CAREC 2016) and an informal review of DPs' engagement (ADB 2016)

Key conclusions:

- Significant investments, incl. infrastructure, capacity building and policy reform
- But need for
 - Oclearer link to SDGs and COP climate goals
 - Obroader sectoral engagement (education, health, ICT, etc.)
 - Ohigher-level political engagement at country level (incl. HoS summit)
 - More intensive engagement by DPs

MORE INTENSIV ENGAGE MENT BY DPS 2016)

- Open/inclusive DP platform
- Protating co-chair SOMs
- DPs' lead roles in key sectoral/thematic areas
- More DP HQ engagement, staff secondment and dedicated points of contact
- DPs' Forum on intermittent basis
- Closer collaboration with CAREC Institute
- Improved information sharing among DPs
