In September 2011, at the 66th Session of the UN General Assembly, President of the Republic of Kazakhstan H.E. Mr.Nursultan Nazarbayev put forward the Global Energy-Environmental Strategy and Green Bridge Partnership Programme to be considered at RIO+20 Summit



Green Bridge Partnership Programme (GBPP)

was approved by two world regions:

Asia Pacific

(UNESCAP 6th Ministerial Conference on Environment and Development, Sept.2010) and **Europe**


(UNECE 7th Ministerial Conference "Environment for Europe", Oct.2011) **Supported**

by the UN Conference for Sustainable Development RIO+20 decision (June, 2012)

Why GBPP

- Lack of capacity of many governments to shift from brown to green economy and no practical mechanisms to support it
- Short-term and ad hoc /fragmented actions are not effective
- Long-term independent professional platform to support policy reforms to enable the flow of sustainable investments, expertise and innovations

Why Regional Level

- Joint action is required for sustainable development reforms
- All ecosystems and sustainable development issues are of transboundary nature
- Expansion of markets for ecological goods and services
- Regional status of potential green projects: transport corridors, tourism, energy and food security etc.

The Content of Green Bridge Partnership Programme

A practical and voluntary mechanism for greening the economy through support of green business and policy reforms at the regional, national and local levels

Main Sectors

- Protection of ecosystems
- Sustainable energy, its availability and efficiency
- Food security
- Urban Infrastructure & Transport
- Adaptation to climate change and natural disasters

GBPP's Main Directions:

- Governance
- Information and Education
- Green Business and Technologies
- Financial and Economic Mechanisms
- Development of common standards for green economy

GBPP's Governing System

Standard management system:

- International Steering Committee
- Professional Secretariat (international staff)
- Monitoring and Reporting Mechanisms

However, the entire management system will depend on specific activities and projects

Financial Mechanism

- •The GBPP will provide for self-financing (including operational costs) through investments and business projects: green energy, new technologies etc.
- •Kazakhstan, as the GBPP initiator, will also contribute to practical implementation at the initial stage, but involvement of other partners to ensure transparency, trust and international expertise is critical

Next Steps for GBPP's practical implementation

The GBPP Road Map-2020 for 2012 includes:

- regional consultations
- development of work plans, practical guidelines and operational procedures
- development of project selection procedures and implementation mechanisms, and other practical steps
