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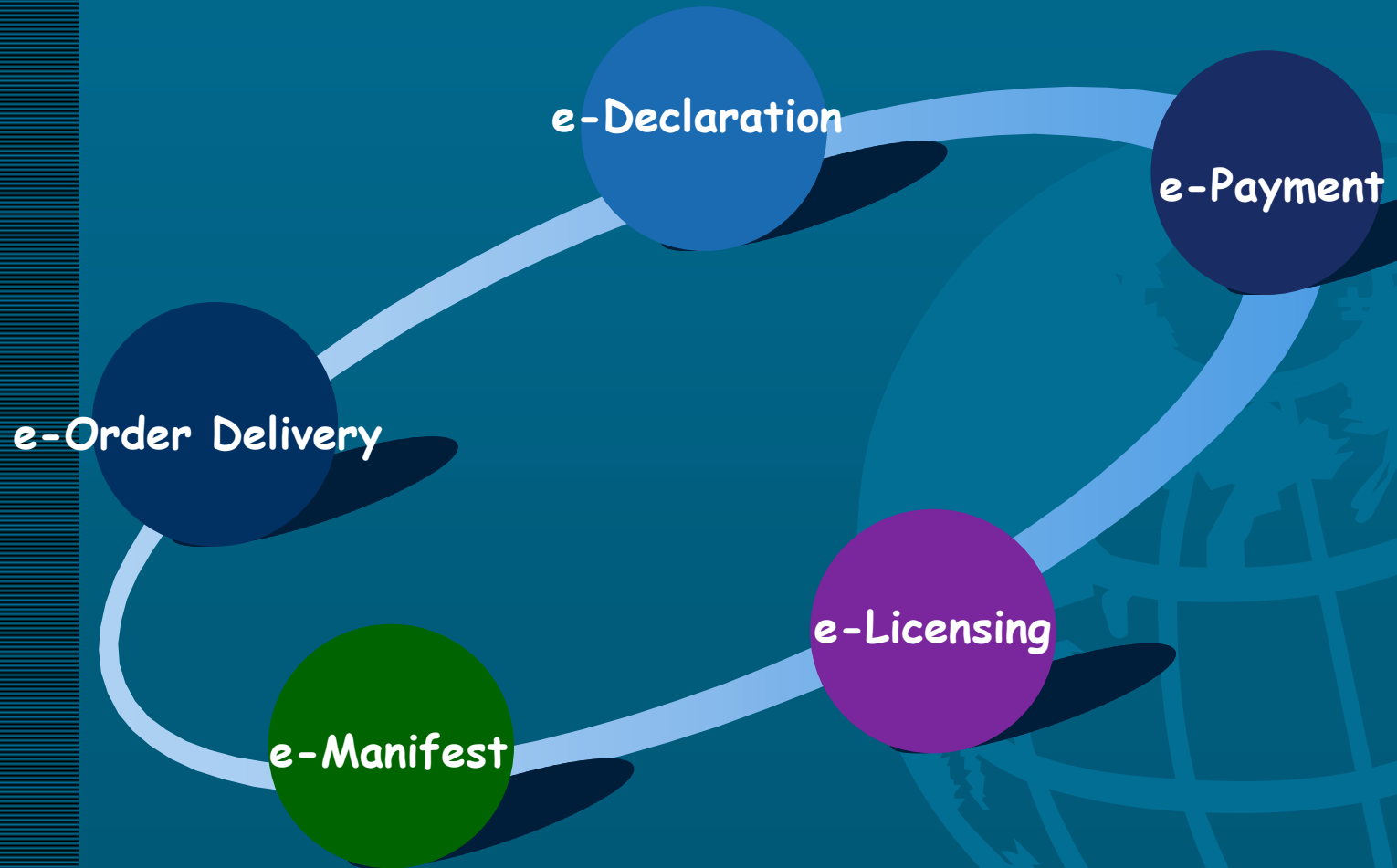

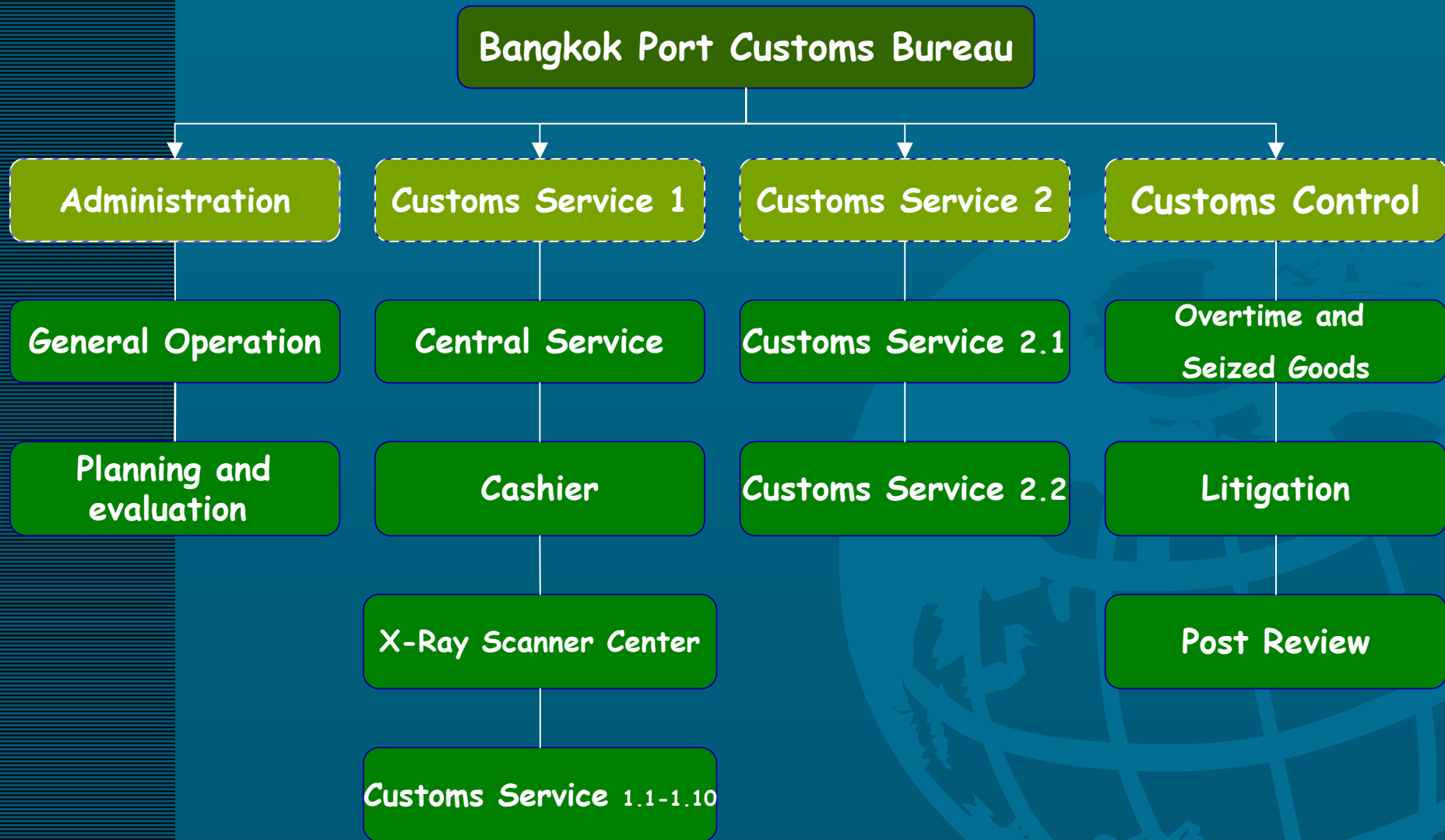

Organization Chart

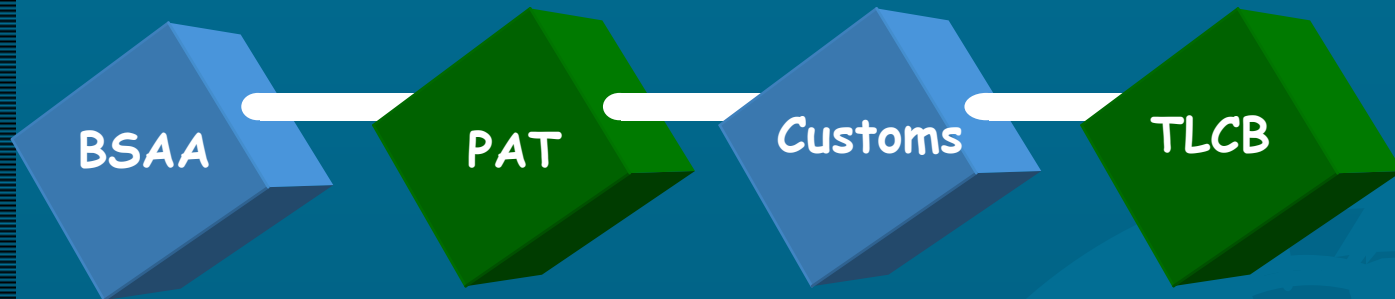


Bangkok Port Customs Bureau

The Bureau is responsible for:

- a. Customs formalities, duty and tax collection, vehicle and cargo control, examination and clearance of imported and exported goods, transshipment goods, and in-transit goods within the Bangkok Port;
- b. enforcement of Customs and related laws and regulations;
- c. disposal of seized and unclaimed goods.

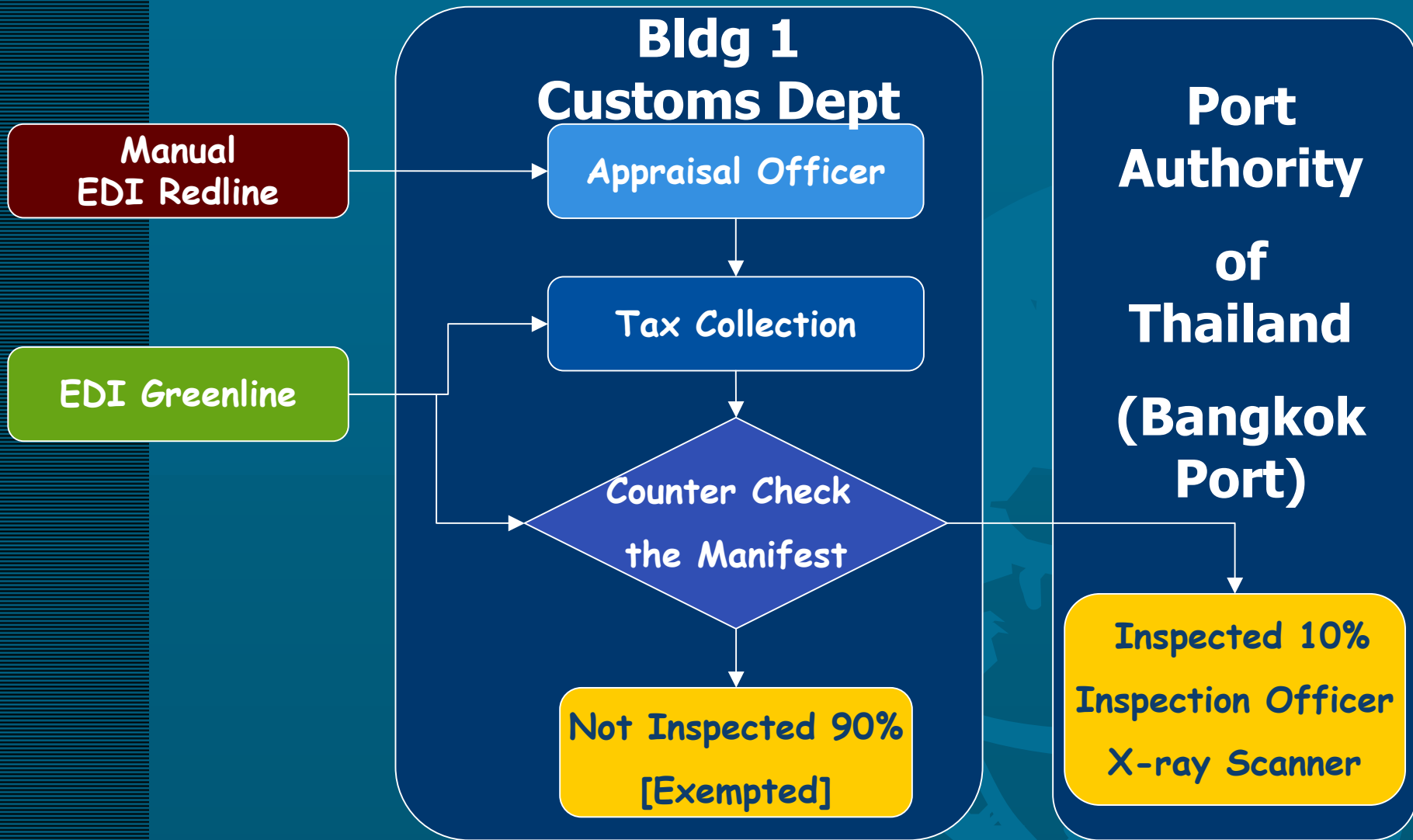
Import Documentation

EDI Import Clearance Procedure

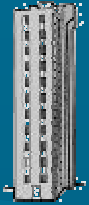
Invoice & Declaration

Importers enter invoice and Declaration data into computer and electronically transmit it to Customs

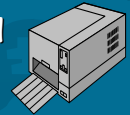

Customs computer verifies the received data, assigns Declaration number and inspection condition (Green/Red Lines)



Importers print out verified Declaration



Importers submit documents for further verification at Customs Formalities Division

Tax and duty payment at Customs cashiers

Importers submit Declaration and supporting documents to warehouses

Customs electronically verifies manifest against Declaration and instructs cargo inspection

Cargo subject to inspection

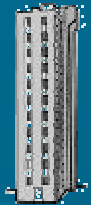
Manual Import Clearance Procedure



Importers prepare Declaration and supporting documents



Importers submit documents for verification at Customs Formalities Division



Enter invoice and Declaration data into computers



Customs verifies the Declaration (tariff & value) and supporting documents manually



Tax and duty payment at Customs cashiers

Importers submit Declaration and supporting documents to warehouses



Customs verifies manifest against Declaration and instructs cargo inspection

Cargo subject to inspection

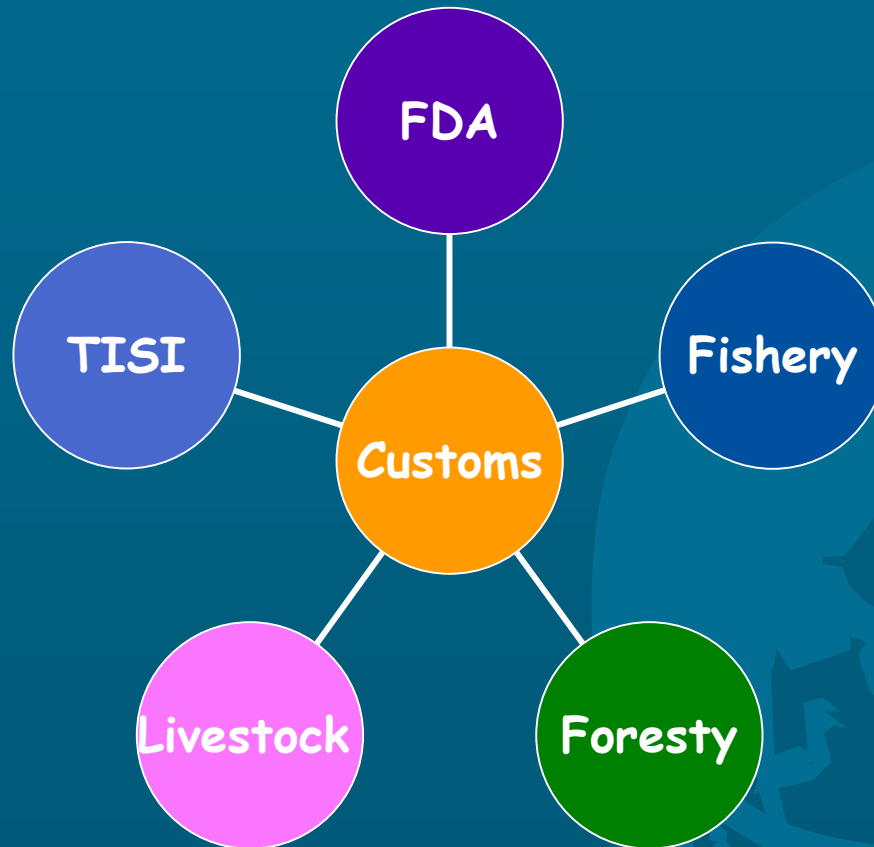

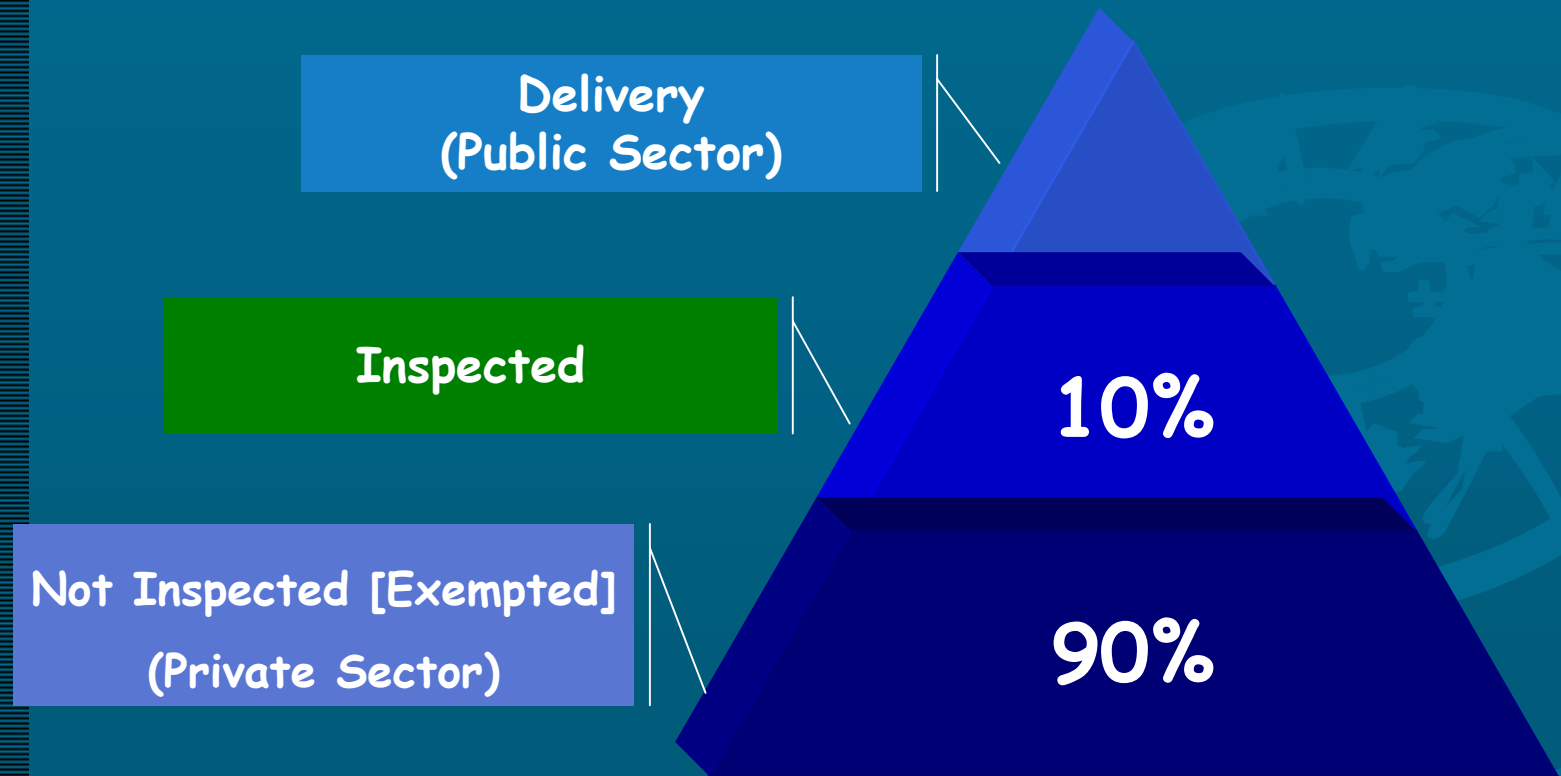

Release Cargo from Custody

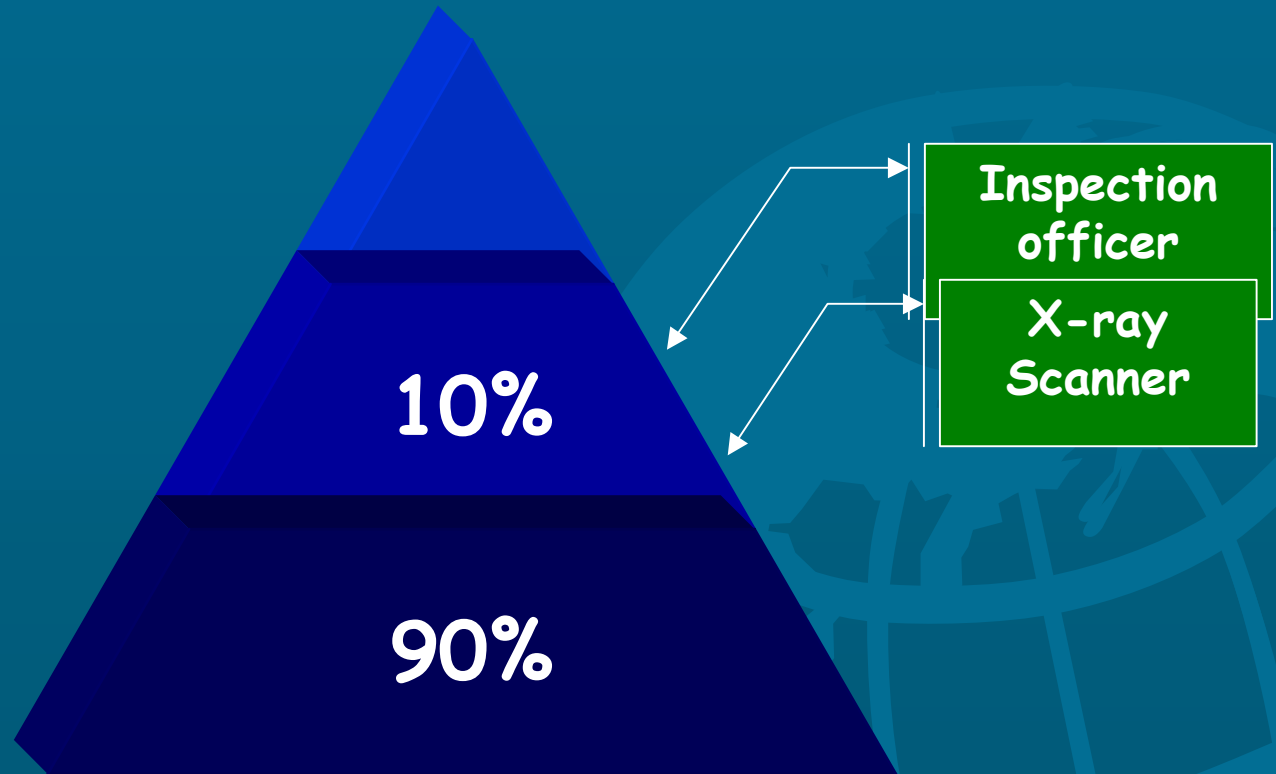


Release Cargo From Custody

- Delivery : Public Sector
- Exempted : Private Sector
- Both follow same procedure
- The inspection officer orders the PAT officer to deliver the Cargo to the importer

The Objective of Cargo Release

- To check actual payment of duty by checking the description of goods, quantity, quality, weight, value and applying the correct tariff and other related duties (VAT, Excise tax etc)

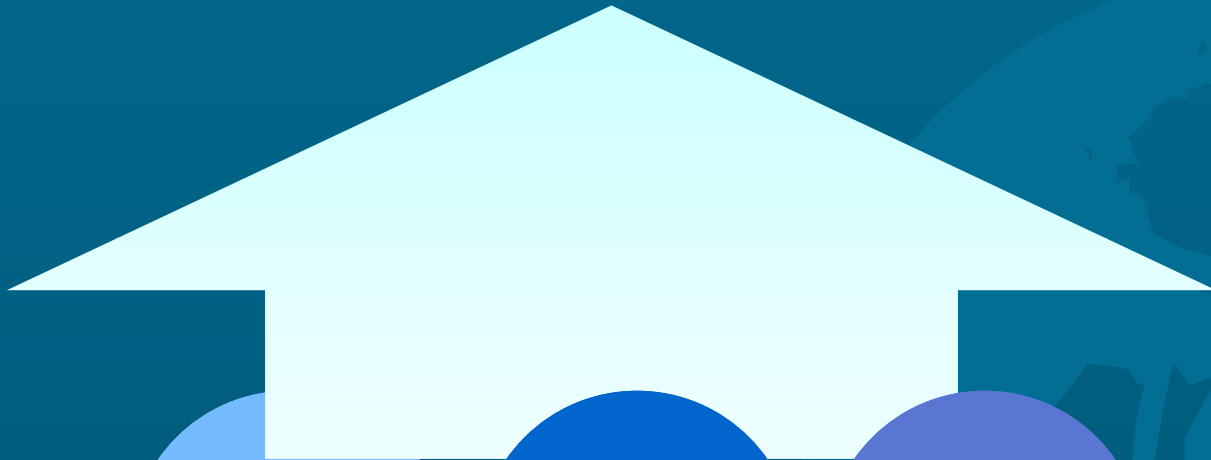
1. Direct Contract to Right Owner within 24 Hrs.
