Paperless Trade as E-commerce enablers

- E-market places brings buyers and sellers together, making contract/commercial procedures easier
- But goods still need to be transported to buyers, goods still need to be paid for,
- and regulations still need to be complied with.
- ... all of which typically involve a lot of paperwork acting as a barrier to cross-border e-commerce development



United Nations ESCAP

- UN ESCAP Asia and the Pacific Regional Branch of the United Nations Secretariat
- 53 member countries covering Central, South, Southeast, East and South Pacific countries
- Mandate: Promote sustainable and inclusive socio-economic development in Asia and the Pacific - through regional cooperation
- Areas covered: <u>Trade, Investment and</u> <u>Innovation</u>, Transport, Macroeconomic Policy, Environment, Emerging Social issues, Information and Communication Technologies

 - (4) Science, Technology and Innovation

Framework Agreement on Trade Facilitation of Cross-Border Paperless in Asia and the Pacific

A new UN Treaty

- Open to interested (53) ESCAP member states
- Enabling and action-oriented agreement

Objective

To facilitate cross-border paperless trade (data exchange) among willing ESCAP member states by providing a dedicated intergovernmental framework to develop legal and technical solutions

*Also supporting full digital implementation of the WTO Trade Facilitation Agreement.

Progress

- Three countries either ratified or acceded (Azerbaijan, Islamic Republic of Iran, and the Philippines)
- Plus, China completed its domestic ratification process.
- Only 1 more country now need to accede or ratify before it enters into force.







Highlighted practices - 1

- Simplification and digitalization of trade procedures: most implemented
- Expedited customs clearance: especially for essential goods

Expert Group Meeting on Trade Facilitation in Time of Crisis and Epidemic

Highlighted practices -2

- **Coordination mechanisms**: considered crucial but lacking (no mandate given to NTFC or equivalent)
- Supporting small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs): crucial and call for regional and multilateral cooperation to achieve cross-border harmonization of trade-related regulations and procedures.
- Transportation, logistics and transit facilitation: holistic approach needed. Especially important for Central Asian landlocked countries.

Expert Group Meeting on Trade Facilitation in Time of Crisis and Epidemic

Recommendations

- Further development for digitalization of trade procedures
- Acceleration of simplification of trade facilitation measures
 - Temporary paperless TF measures to permanent
- Need for capacity building
 - Trade digitalization and simplification of trade facilitation measure
- Emphasize on the regional cooperation
 - Learning and sharing experiences
 - Regional initiatives such as the Framework Agreement

UN Global Survey on Digital and Sustainable Trade Facilitation

Objective

- To monitor progress on trade facilitation (TF), including paperless trade and other forward-looking measures towards SDGs
- To enable evidence-based policy making, capacity building and tech. assistance

2015: 1st global survey on trade facilitation implementation; presented at the 5th Global Review of Aid for Trade. [partnerships with UNCTAD, ITC, OECD, Subregional org...]

- 2017: 2nd global survey; presented at the 6th Global AfT Review. [new partnerships: ADB, Rep. of Korea...]
- 2018: Launch of interactive website (now UNTFSURVEY.ORG)
- 2019: 3rd global survey Digital and Sustainable Trade Facilitation [new partnerships: ICC (Banking Commission)]
- 2021: 4th Adding additional survey component on TF measures in time of crisis and epidemic
