









Road crash fatalities in Asia-Pacific and CAREC








Road crash fatality rates, 2010-2019




2/3-wheeler and LDV per thousand population

Share (%) of road crash fatalities by road user










Share of pedestrian deaths in road crash fatalities













Cost of road crash fatalities vs. health expenditure






