DOMESTIC PREPARATION AND COORDINATION

1- Formulating Consensus on National Objectives

- a) Engagement of all concerned parties in the accession process to build maximum support and avoid internal problems at later stage.
- b) Launching of active public awareness campaigns through the media and otherwise about the WTO, its agreements, accession and implications or membership.
- c) Effective cooperation among the executive and legislative branches of Government.
- d) Effective public-private sector partnerships for a smooth accession process.
- e) Mobilization of necessary resources, both financial and in kind, to fund the accession process.
- f) Realistic Cost Analysis before starting of accession process.
- g) Consolidate positioning of acceding countries before starting of negotiation.
- h) Rigorous exercise by countries to make fundamental changes in legal and institutional framework to implement major structural economic reforms.

DOMESTIC PREPARATION AND COORDINATION

2- Managing Domestic Pressures, diverse stakeholders interests, multiple ministries and agencies

- a) Establishment of proper institutional framework of acceding countries for accession process, ideally one body or committee.
- b) Information centers on WTO and specialized areas such as standardization, sanitary and phyto-sanitary services, and intellectual property rights should be established.

DOMESTIC PREPARATION AND COORDINATION

3- Balancing the degree of liberalization before accession with the leverage needed for negotiations.

- a) Countries willingness to participate in the world trading system by making legislative changes, e.g in areas like intellectual property rights and tariff reduction before starting the accession process.**
- b) Transparency and predictability should be the guiding principles for legal reform.**
- c) Not to implement too many liberalization measures before the accession process.**
