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Process for the development of the CAREC Road Safety Strategy

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Background to the strategy

- United Nations Decade of Action for Road Safety 2011-2020
- Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) to improve road safety
- Global Plan for the Decade of Action for Road Safety 2011-2020 provides a framework for national and regional strategies:
 - "safe system" approach to road safety
 - five pillars for organizing activities



CAREC Ministerial Commitment to Road Safety

- 14th Ministerial Conference in Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia, in September 2015 endorsed a joint commitment to road safety:
 - Collective action to improve road safety cooperation and consistency in approach across CAREC
 - Adopting international good practice in road safety ("safe systems" approach) and building on existing efforts
 - Region-wide approaches supported by joint capacity building and knowledge sharing activities

 CAREC partnership and multilateral development partners is an effective platform from which to improve road safety





ADB Technical Assistance Program

- Support from a team of consultants for:
 - CAREC Regional Road Safety Review to inform the strategy
 - Development of the CAREC Road Safety Strategy
 - Development of Guidelines on Road Safety Engineering for CAREC Countries
 - Regional capacity development program focused on key areas of need as identified through the strategy





Process and progress to date

• Initial consultation and document review:

- Consultation with organizations supporting road safety in the region, including European Union TRACECA Road Safety II Project
- Review of documents and information from CAREC and member countries
- Review of documents and information from multilateral development partners supporting the CAREC program



Process and progress to date

- CAREC country missions in late 2015 to Pakistan, Kazakhstan, Mongolia, Kyrgyz Republic, Azerbaijan
- Other country missions over the next few months
- Meetings held with senior officials from key ministries involved in:
 - Road design, construction and maintenance
 - Traffic policing
 - Provision of emergency medical response
 - Driver licensing and training.



Process and progress to date

- Meetings also held with:
 - Road safety and transport research organizations
 - NGOs involved in road safety, Red Cross and Red Crescent Societies
 - Transport driver unions and transport company associations
 - Private industry involved in transport logistics
 - Representatives from multilateral development partners
 - Representatives in CAREC countries from WHO.



Process and progress to date

- Analysis of crash and transport data:
 - from a range of global and regional sources
 - provided by CAREC countries during country missions, and will include data being presented at this workshop





Process and progress to date

- This planning workshop held in association with the CAREC Transport Sector Coordinating Committee (TSCC) meeting. Focused on
- Second workshop to be held in September 2016 will focus on:
 - development of a regional action plan
 - consideration of actions at the national level linked with national road safety strategies and action plans.





Next steps

- Refine the framework for the CAREC Road Safety Strategy based on input from this workshop
- Complete an analysis of the regional road safety situation
- Complete country missions
- Conduct second workshop and finalise the action plan
- Present the CAREC Road Safety Strategy to the 15th CAREC Ministerial Conference on 26 October 2016
- Implement regional capacity development program
- Implement national road safety projects
