Institutional and financing mechanism

- Engage key members in the CPMM team to support implementation effort so that CAREC Institute can continue the CPMM implementation seamlessly. This includes
 - Hiring new staff and training Human Resources.
 - Designated staff allocation for CPMM.
 - Formation of cross divisional (RD, CBD and KMD) task force.
- Securing Financing through designated TA. Or securing financing from external sources.

CPMM Annual Report, Promotion and Administration

- CPMM flagship annual report will be published by CI.
 - Cl's can play a greater role in the CPMM AR publication.
 - Cl's independence in publication we can do quick CPMM publications (CPMM AR, or policy briefs). Cl's policy briefs have generated more impact.
- Organize a CPMM Symposium to attract researchers, academicians and multilateral partners to review progress, offer feedback and recommendations as well as co-develop new use cases for CPMM.
- Present output to SOM/GC/MC
- Develop an implementation schedule (ADB + CI) at the beginning of every year.
