



CAREC Multimodal Corridor Network



CAREC Strategy 2030: Transport Sector Development

- Will continue to advance the regional infrastructure agenda with deeper coverage of existing topics and subsectors, and expansion into new areas such as aviation
- Will focus on reliable and sustainable transport systems including regional and cross-border infrastructure
- Will support improving connectivity among CAREC countries and beyond CAREC geography, and with new development partners, including private sector (financing, infrastructure, logistics)
- Will include specific analytical tools for prioritization of projects and for priority project preparation (project preparatory facility)
- Additional emphasis will be placed in improving the quality of CAREC corridors
- Will adopt phased approach to implementation, with revision of goals every 3 years



CAREC Transport Sector Proposed actions for 2018-2019

- Prepare new CAREC Transport Strategy 2030, aligned with CAREC goals and Transport Sustainability goals for endorsement by next CAREC TSCC and SOM
- Finalize and disseminate knowledge products (on Road Safety, Railways, Road Asset Management, Aviation)
- Prepare and approve Technical Assistance projects to support CAREC Transport Sector work and CAREC Railways sector work during the implementation period of 2018-2021
