International Trade in Agrifood

- International food trade is US\$1.3 trillion a year industry, with billions of tonnes of food produced, marketed and transported
- Trade in high-value products —fruits, vegetables, meat, and dairy—increased the highest among food products.
- Expansion of Agrifood trade brought high-profile food safety scares
- International trade in food products is regulated with ever more stringent requirements
- Key hurdle for central Asian countries to increase exports is slow adoption of internationally food safety standards.

Why Develop a Food Safety Network for CAREC?



- Global food supply chains
- Similar eco-systems, small economy and capacity constrains
- One-stop source of information for CAREC countries
- Trusted environment to enhance trade within CAREC countries and beyond
- Some CAREC countries represented in inappropriate groupings (i.e., Europe)

Benefits of Regional Networks

- Harmonize international food safety laws and regulations (EU, ASEAN)
- Alert members to common food safety problems and develop collaborative preventative approach (EU, ASEAN)
- Participate to foster regional food safety issues in international agencies (all networks)
- Share laboratory expertise and accreditation (EU, African, ASEAN, Latin America)
- Use regional reference laboratories (EU)
- Share experience and expertise in food safety risk analysis (EU)




CAREC Food Safety Network Could Include



- Food safety international regulations database
- Capacity building, sharing of best practices, posting news,
 case studies and training materials and online courses.
- Share Regional Resources for accreditation, certification, reference laboratories, joint food analysis method
- Regional Food Safety Risk Analysis Body for regional risk assessments, developing risk profile, risk ranking, and work with Codex for regional issues
- Link to global food safety networks i.e., FAO/WHO JEMRA, JECFA and JMPR reports,
 WTO, and private sector standards

Regional Codex Committees

- Some food products are of regional interest, Codex Global may not be able to set standards for these
- Some CAREC countries are represented in Regional Codex Committees
 - Codex Europe- Regional standard for Chanterelle
 - Codex Asia Regional standard for Tempeh
- CAREC Food Safety Network develop regional standards
 - Fermented cheese balls Kurut
 - Regional Dairy products
 - Native dry fruits and nuts



CAREC Food Safety Network: Regional Food Safety Risk Analysis

- Establish Regional Expert Group to perform risk ranking, prioritise food safety issues, develop risk profiles, perform risk assessments.
- Develop standards for regional products for Regional Codex Committee.
- Develop coordinated regional response in standard setting bodies with Codex Committees.
- Develop plans for possible activities such as regional accreditation and certification bodies, and regional reference laboratories.
