CAREC 2030 defines CAREC Institute's role as a leading center to providing knowledge solutions. CI is expected to perform this role, among others, by:


Building formal links with academia and think tanks in the region to make best use of local knowledge.

Cl 2018-22 Strategy identifies *Promoting Partnership and Networking* as one of the key Strategic Objectives. Cl achieves this strategic objective by:

Closely cooperating with member countries, international organizations, universities, think tanks, Civil Society Organizations (CSOs) and private sector.

Establishing the CTTN

- Leading think tanks from the CAREC member countries agreed to establish the CAREC Think Tanks Network (CTTN) during the second CAREC Think Tanks Development Forum (CTTDF) in Urumqi, People's Republic of China (PRC), in 2017
- The "Urumqi Declaration" became the founding document of the CTTN. As of now, numerous prominent think tanks and universities representatives from 11 countries of the CAREC region are members.
- The CTTN promotes the regional economic cooperation by enhancing systemic regional knowledge sharing, fostering policy research and knowledge solutions.



The 4th Think Tanks Forum: Thematic focus

Theme

"Trading for Shared Prosperity"

Forum Topics

- Global Trade Frictions
- Impact of Technology on Trade and policy implications for CAREC countries
- Readiness of CAREC countries for embracing E-commerce

The 4th Think Tanks Forum: Key Messages

- Increase investments in infrastructure and connectivity, scale up support to SMEs, and extend support to regional value chains
- Invest in tourism development and expand cross-border tourism given the diverse cultural heritage of the region
- Intensify regional trade and investment cooperation through completing negotiations on regional trade initiatives
- Gear up for benefitting from PRC's likely expansion of trade and investment with BRI countries

The 4th Think Tanks Forum: key Messages

- International cooperation is imperative to harmonize laws and revamp existing taxation frameworks in member countries for seamless cross-border
- Increase investment on the provision of ICT infrastructure (affordability and access), introduce legal, regulatory and institutional reforms to promote incountry and cross-border e- commerce
- Improve logistics and delivery infrastructure and intensify regional efforts for modernizing and harmonizing standards and regulations
- Draw lessons from global and regional success stories, particularly from Chinese experience of alleviating poverty through using e-commerce platforms for agricultural products

The 4th Think Tanks Forum: key Messages

Revamping the CTTN and the Forum

- Initiate joint research programs involving 2-3 think tanks and covering at least two countries
- Exchange of professionals/researchers among CTTN members with the support of CAREC Institute
- Initiate branding campaign for CTTN members for their research output
- Expand participation invite private sector, parliamentarians, and design a special session for development partners engaged in the CAREC region
- Establish interactive online platform (website) for CTTN to share data, information and knowledge
- Involve of CTTN members in forum theme, topic and venue selection

The 4th TTF Key Messages

Actions & Way forward

Research Grants Program

- Awarded to five researchers on following topics:
 - Assessing participation of CAREC countries in global and regional value chains
 - Study of cross-border tourism value chains between Uzbekistan and Kyrgyzstan
 - The impact of sanitary, phytosanitary, and quality-related standards on the trade flow between CAREC countries and Georgia
 - Opportunities and challenges for agri-food trade between Kyrgyzstan and Pakistan
 - Building bankable and viable regional cooperation programs based on trust

Second round to commence in December 2019

Visiting Fellowship Program

- ADB Vice President Mr. Shixin Chen announced launching of a three-month long Visiting Fellowship Program at the CAREC Institute in Urumqi, PRC, to
 - Foster a research environment and deliver new insights on topics consistent with CAREC 2030 strategy priority clusters
- Fellows will be selected from all member countries of ADB, particularly those who have an interest in comparative inter- and intra-regional studies

CTTN Talk Series

The CAREC Institute plans to launch the CTTN Talk Series where different CTTN members will be invited to Urumqi to:

- Showcase their research findings, answer pertinent questions emerging from the Institute's knowledge sharing and networking activities,
- Draw parallels and contribute value-added research products to the existing body of knowledge.
- Two think tanks from CTTN will be invited to CI headquarters each quarter
- Criteria and guidelines to be developed

Expand Participation

- CI had invited development partners especially 5 CAREC Program Partners (in addition to ADB)
- Regional offices of WB, IMF and UNDP attended the 3rd TTF in Bishkek
- Cl invited the private sector in the 3rd TTF
- Going forward, in the 5th TTF CI is considering to arrange a session for development partners to learn about their research needs for the region
- Invited four non-CAREC think tanks in 4th TTF
- Considering inviting parliamentarians in the future
