Objective:

The services sector has become the largest contributor to GDP, and international trade in services has also become the most dynamic segment of world trade, growing more quickly than trade in goods. In Mongolia, this reached US\$4 billion in 2019 and accounted for 18% of total goods and services trade. However the US\$2 billion trade deficit in services has also been increasing and adversely affects the balance of payments. This must be managed, and diversification in the sector must also be addressed. This requires **better collection of statistics** on trade in services.

At the same time, digital transactions have become the norm all over the world. Statistical monitoring by governments must be able to keep pace with this trend, if statistics are to reliably present the condition of a country. Good statistical capacities and output are important for policy evaluation and strategy formulation. These complement and will be complemented by Mongolia's efforts to become a Digital Nation by 2024.

The objective of the workshop therefore is to strengthen Mongolia's system of compiling, processing, and reporting statistics on trade in services and the digital economy by training national agencies that are charged with such responsibility.
