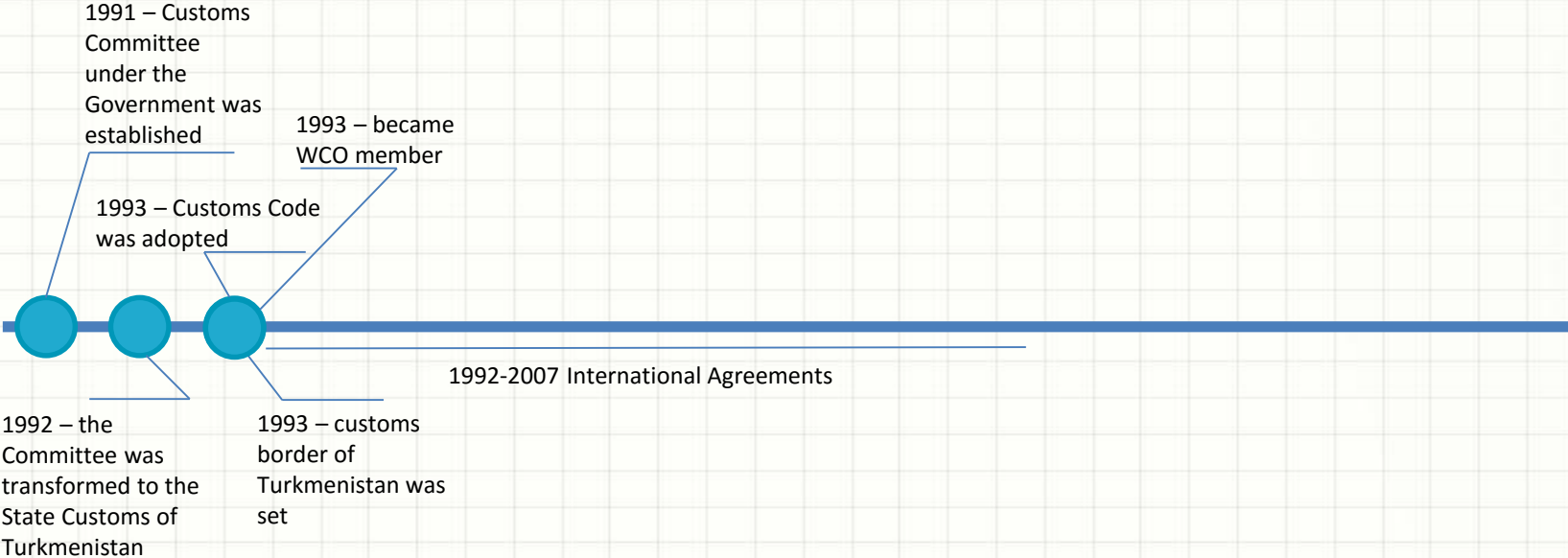
On 17th of May 1993 Turkmenistan became the member of the World Customs Organization

On October 8th 1993 the Customs Code of Turkmenistan was adopted

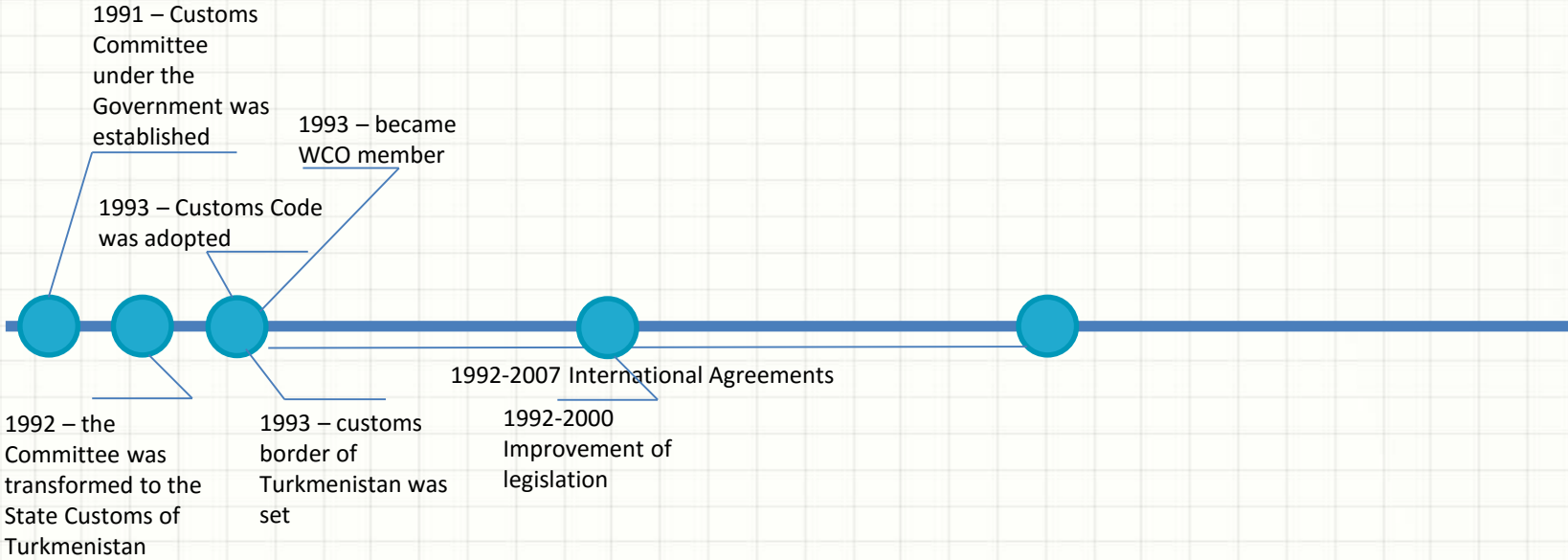

Agreements were signed on various areas of customs



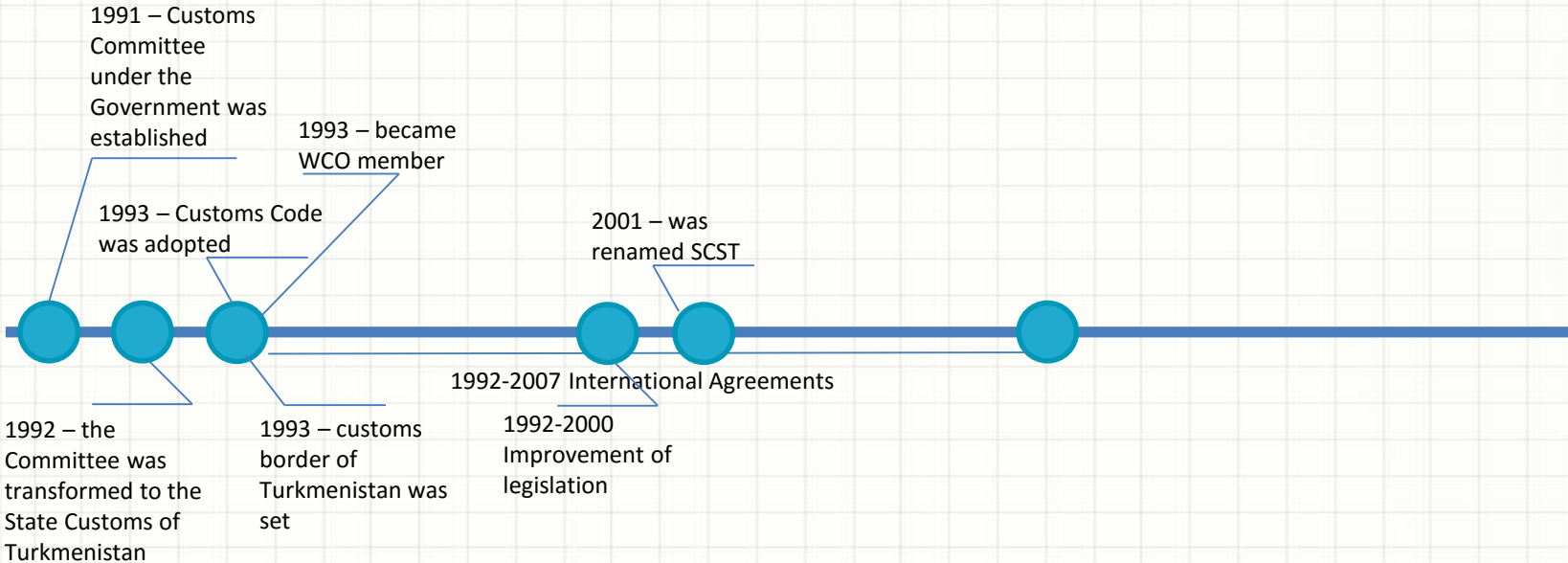

A number of legal enactments have been adopted in the areas of customs



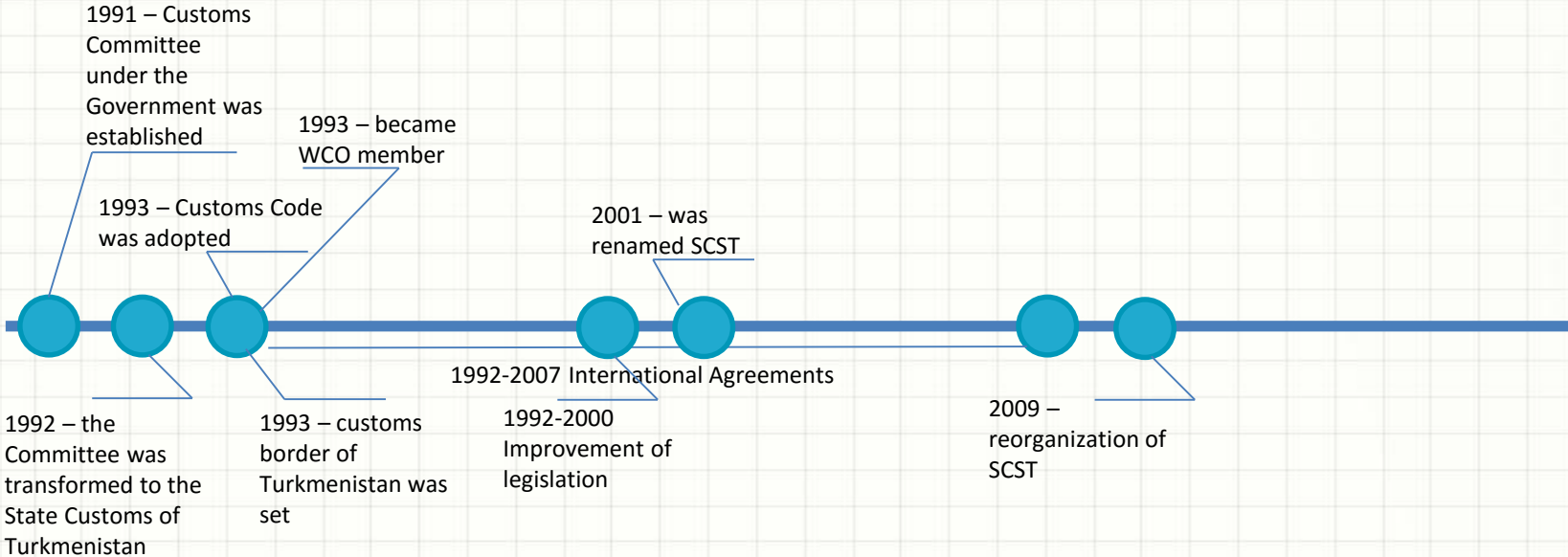

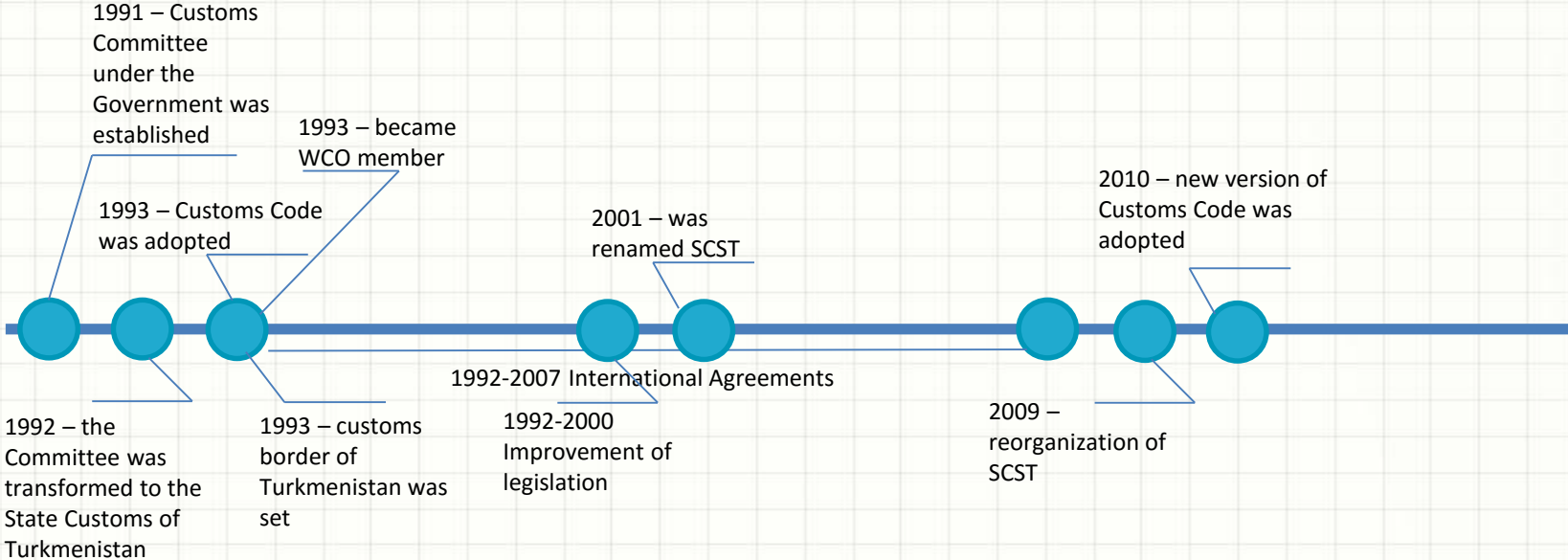
Reorganization of the State Customs Service of Turkmenistan

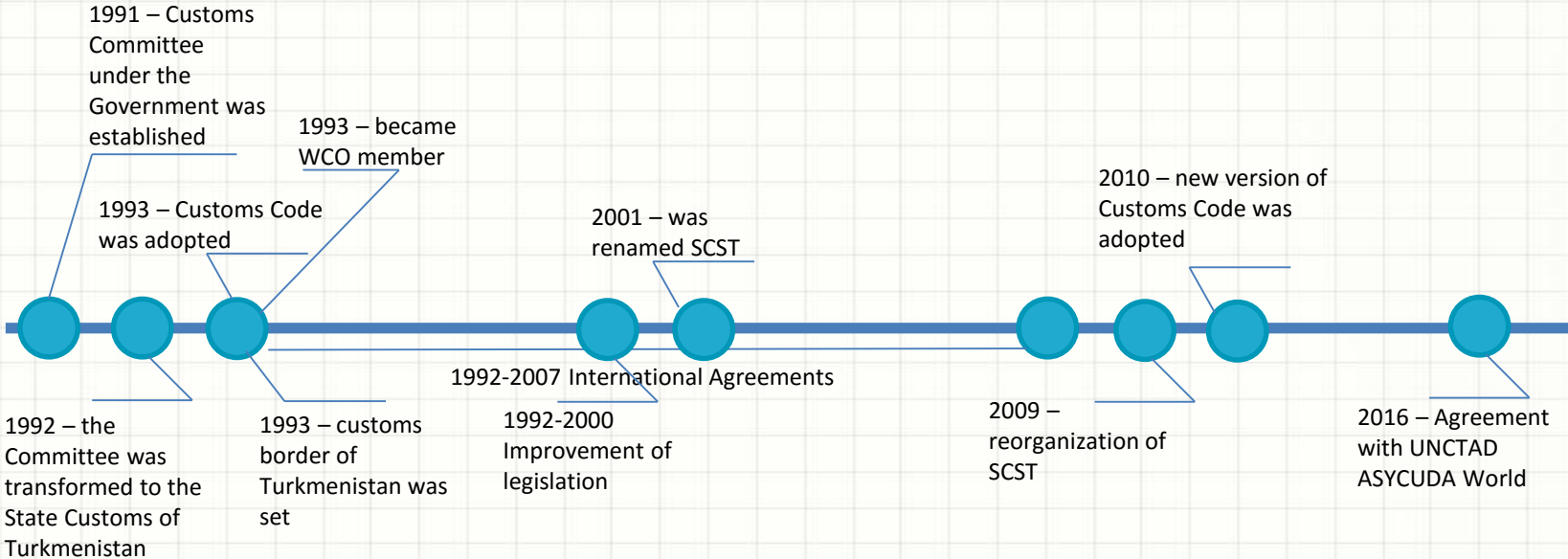
The Law of Turkmenistan “About Customs Service” was adopted

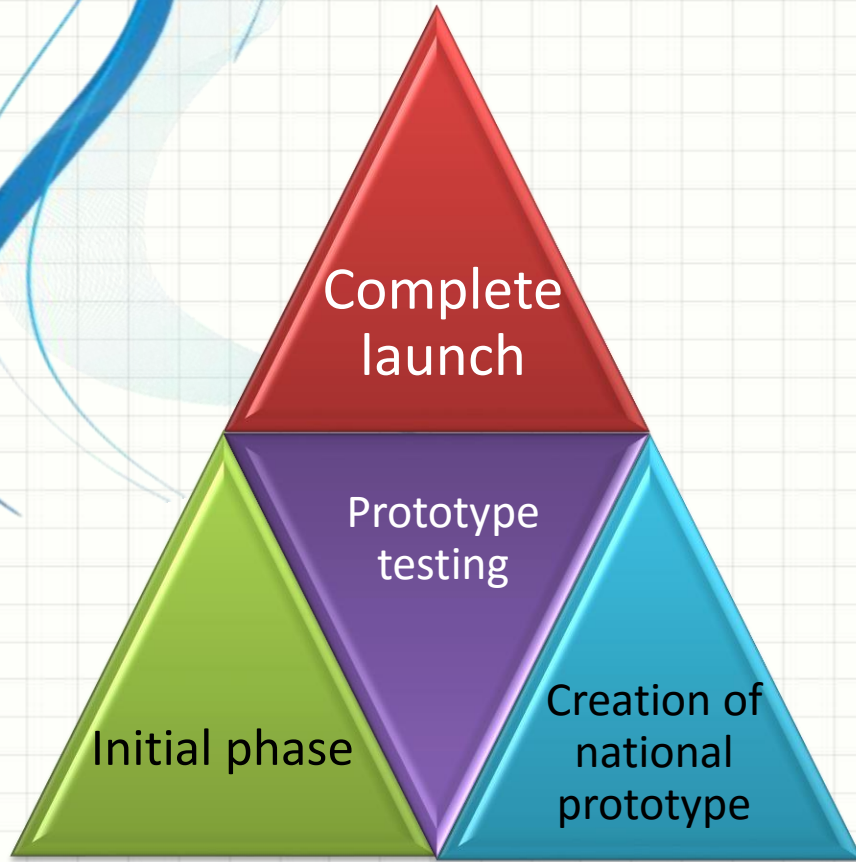
