Role of Transit Trade in Central Asia

- Landlockedness makes transit trade very important for central Asian countries
- The Euro-Asia continental bridge and middle corridors need smooth transit operations
- * The overall picture of transit (statistics and other issues) is less clear
- Can be more volatile than exports and imports (depending on other countries and global transit market)
- Countries need to work closely together



Transit facilitation and challenges

- Freedom of Transit (Article V of the GATT)
 - > Equal treatment
 - Prohibition of unnecessary delays or restrictions and prohibition to levy Customs duties, transit duties and other transit-related charges
- Transit has been highlighted as one of the key elements of the WCO Economic Competitiveness Package (ECP)

- Challenges in transit transport
 - > non-harmonized national and international regulations
 - obligatory involvement of operators in the transit country, e.g., national carriers, national Customs brokers, etc.
 - > additional documentation requirements in the transit countries
 - > obligatory use of facilities, such as bonded warehouses
 - > non-allowance of return cargo in the transit country
 - inefficient border crossings leading to waiting times and additional costs
 - > non-allowance of trucks of other countries to enter and operate



Recent development for customs transit

- European Union (EU) New
 Computerized Transit System (NCTS)
- Association of Southeast Asian
 Nations (ASEAN) Customs Transit
 System (ACTS)
- ACTS/NCTS becoming a preferred model for Customs transit transport for other regions of the world

- Electronic declaration, with validity check of information
- Computer based real time messaging
- Knowledge of trader through registration and monitoring of performance, and incentives for proven reliability
- Secure, enforceable guarantees, with cross-border validity
- Specifications for the means of transport

* Europe (NCTS) – Central Asia (CATS/ICE) – ASEAN (ACTS)



CAREC Advance Transit System (CATS)/Information Common Exchange (ICE)

- Digitized and streamlined and harmonized transit documentation
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 - based on the T1 form of NCTS
- * a risk-based affordable guarantee mechanism that rewards compliant traders
 - > different guarantee levels based on risks
 - > Able to guarantee multiple transit movements
- A single electronic messaging system among customs
 - > An ICE prototype has been developed
- * Flexibility and integrability vis-à-vis national customs' own systems
- Seamless interoperability with NCTS and ACTS



Legal, regulatory and operational issues

- International best practices and practical solutions for resolving legal, regulatory and operational challenges
- Stakeholder consultation, close and coordinated work guided by working groups
- Knowledge sharing with those customs embracing NCTS and ACTS
