

Introduction to ASEAN Customs Transit System (ACTS)

Background





- The ASEAN Customs Transit System, or ACTS has been developed by ASEAN Member States, with the technical assistance programmes funded by the European Union
- ACTS implements Protocol 7: Customs
 Transit System, of the ASEAN Framework
 Agreement on the Facilitation of Goods in
 Transit
- ACTS is <u>operating live</u> in the participating ASEAN Member States: Cambodia, Lao PDR, Malaysia, Singapore, Thailand and Viet Nam from 2 November 2020

Facilitation of movement of goods



The overall ACTS objective is

"to simplify and harmonize transport, trade and Customs regulations and to establish an effective, efficient, integrated and harmonized transit transport system in ASEAN"

ACTS is designed to balance the <u>facilitation</u> and <u>control</u> of the goods in transit, moving from place to place between participating ASEAN Member States





Goods move freely from one location to another crossing as many borders between participating ASEAN Member States as needed in the sealed compartment on a truck under Customs control and suspension of duties and taxes





Single Bank Guarantee

covers the duties and taxes at risk for the cross border entire journey





Goods move under single digital

Customs Transit Declaration submitted at departure and valid throughout the whole journey





Single truck can be used to transport the goods cross border from departure location all the way to the destination location





Common set of laws, regulations and procedures for moving goods in the ASEAN region are applied





Duties and taxes are only paid at the country of import wherever that may be after transit is completed

Processing at Departure





Trader Submits Declaration To Customs - Online

- Declaration Details
- Guarantee Details

ACTS automatically validates declaration and assigns ACTS Reference Number (ARN)

- ARN is sent online to Trader
- Trader can move goods to Customs Office of Departure

Processing at Departure





Customs may decide to inspect the movement before departure

- Documentary and/or physical inspection of the Goods
- Declaration may need amending by the trader principal if discrepancies are found

Processing at Departure





Customs releases the goods for transit

- Truck is sealed and seals registered in ACTS
- Consignment is released for transit
- Transit Accompanying Document
 (TAD) is printed and given to the driver
- Adequate guarantee amount is locked

Processing at Transit






Driver presents Transit Accompanying Document (TAD) to Customs

 Customs scan ARN barcode into ACTS to access declaration details received from Customs Office of Departure earlier

Processing at Transit






Customs inspect condition of seals

- If seals are not broken, Customs will not inspect the goods
- Customs can inspect accompanying documentation, permits and even inspect the goods if there is good reason to do so
- If seals are broken for inspection, new seals will be affixed by Customs and registered in ACTS

Processing at Transit





Customs allow truck to cross the border

- Customs decision registered in ACTS
- In the event that there were issues,
 Customs may either turn the truck
 back or stop the movement

Processing at Destination





Driver presents TAD to Customs on Arrival

- Customs scan ARN barcode into ACTS to access declaration details received from Customs Office of Departure earlier
- Customs Register Arrival Notification

Customs will decide to inspect or not to and on the type of inspection that will be performed

Documentary and/or physical inspection of goods

Processing at Destination





Customs will register in ACTS Control/Inspection findings

- If there are no discrepancies the goods are released from transit. The next customs procedure can then commence (import, temporary storage, re-export, etc.)
- If there are discrepancies, resolution may be required prior to releasing the goods from transit
