## Kyrgyz Republic-Tajikistan Cross-Border Transport Agreement

- Signed and ratified by two countries
- Protocol on Afghanistan's accession
  - Signed by Tajikistan and Afghanistan
  - Awaiting signing by Kyrgyz Republic
- New protocols may be needed
  - On market access and permits
  - On a proposed simplified customs transit regime
- Proposed revised implementing action plan



## **Proposed Implementing Action Plan**

- Implementation should be:
  - gradual so that it can be adjusted as it develops
  - sequenced based on analysis of criticality of provisions
- Immediate focus on highly critical provisions
  - traffic rights exchange, operator licensing, market access
  - cross-border movement of vehicles
- Next priority are moderately critical provisions
  - mutual recognition of 3rd party motor liability insurance
  - customs transit
  - abolition of non-cost related charges
  - facilitation of border-crossing formalities



### **Roundtable Seminar on Corridor-Based Transport Facilitation Arrangements**

- Agreed with National Focal Points to hold seminars
- Seminar to be held in Beijing on 2-3 July
  - Presentations by 10 countries on their agreements
  - Presentation of model CBTA
  - Presentations of experience in Latin America, and Viet Nam/Cambodia and Viet Nam/Lao PDR/Thailand
  - Recommendations on possible future approaches for CAREC

- Afghanistan's accession to the Kyrgyz Republic-Tajikistan Cross-Border Transport Agreement (CBTA)
- Prepare implementation of the CBTA
  - Start carrying out action plan
  - Negotiate new protocol
- Conduct seminar(s) on transport facilitation arrangements in the CAREC region
