# CPMM 2011 Findings

## **BCPs are major bottlenecks**

#### Major delays at BCPs due to:

- waiting time in queue (for road average 5.6 hrs and for rail 29.6 hrs)
- loading and unloading of goods and cargo (average 4.0 hrs)
- customs clearance (average 1.8 hrs)
- for rail, change of railway gauge ( average 34.9 hrs)

# Major contributors to total cost in clearing BCPs:

- custom clearance (average of \$124)
- repair/tire replacement (average of \$104)
- loading and unloading fees
   (average of \$79)

 Organizational meeting for a CAREC SPS working group - October 2012 Conference on Regional Cooperation and Integration — Experiences in Asia and Pacific

180 participants from 30 developing member countries attended

Aside from CAREC, Greater Mekong Subregion (GMS) and South Asia Subregional Economic Cooperation (SASEC) presented achievements, issues and future plans to strengthen RCI.

Trade facilitation session elicited wide interest among participants.

## Regional Cooperation in Trade Facilitation, Trade and Investment and Regional Financial Integration

#### **KEY MESSAGES**

- Regional integration in trade and finance is a long-term undertaking, and requires deeper efforts at various levels and considerable national-level readiness
- 2. Trade facilitation is multi-sectoral and multi-dimensional. Some progress made on this front, but a lot more efforts needed to improve trade through border and behind-the-border measures, to keep pace with physical investments.
- 3. Trade facilitation and trade & investment liberalization measures should be pursued in parallel in a wellcoordinated manner within sub-regional groupings and across the region

#### Looking Forward

- 1. Begin with RC and sequence policy and regulatory reforms for RI. (i) adopt measures that help mobility of goods and services in a mutually beneficial manner; (ii) innovative financing solutions to help private sector (e.g. leasing; logistics); (iii) integration of capital markets can begin with national reforms, followed by harmonization
- 2. Continuously promote trade cooperation. (i) Address incentive issues affecting different stakeholders, and enhance their commitment; (ii) adopt integrated trade facilitation measures, and set realistic and sequenced TF deliverables, with clear performance indicators and accountability; (iii) coordinate with private sector, and adopt new technology solutions that reduce human interface
- 3. Promote trade facilitation in an integrated manner with investment liberalization and promotion. (i) FTA negotiations and sub-regional and WTO efforts could be platforms for promoting trade and FDI; (ii) address supply chain constraints through coordinated investments along with trade promotion; (iii) promote regional hubs or economic clusters.
