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


Endorsement Sanitary and Phytosanitary (SPS) Agreement

■ Value of Agricultural Imports


■ Value of Agricultural Exports



Output 1: Regulations for meeting international food safety standards developed (Group I, Phase I)

- National food safety strategy for Afghanistan, Azerbaijan, and Pakistan;
- Secondary regulation and guidelines for Tajikistan and Kyrgyz Republic to operationalize national food safety strategies.



Output 2. Laboratory rationalization and infrastructure requirements for international food safety standards identified (Group I, Phase I)

- Laboratory buildings rehabilitation/construction
- Laboratory equipment to carry out diagnostic tests
- Cold chain logistic, storage/processing infrastructure, refrigerated trucks
- Loading and unloading facilities/equipment
- Quarantine and disinfection facilities at boarder control points.

Output 3: National and regional international food safety working groups developed (Group I and II, Phase II)

- National food safety standards working group -involves multiple agencies
- Regional food safety standard working groups
 - transboundary diseases and pest,
 regionally coordinated surveillance program
 regional representation on food safety issues



Output 4: Regional capacity for effective institutionalization of international food safety standards developed(Group I and II, Phase II)

- In-country trainings and workshops
- Training for traditional, domestic and export markets
- Workshops on food safety for border control technical agencies
- Exchange programs and knowledge sharing 'South-South Cooperation'.
- Regional workshops to discuss findings and options of the proposed TA

- TA Report, approval Sept 2016
- Implementation Period, Oct 2016 April 2019 (2.5 years)
- Budget \$ 2 Million (Phase I and II)
