# **CAREC Integrated Trade Agenda (CITA) 2030**

CITA 2030 aims to assist CAREC members in integrating further with the global economy through: (i) trade expansion from increased market access, (ii) greater diversification, and (iii) stronger institutions for trade.

### CITA priorities and interventions include—

- (i) Support for members to comply with their WTO commitments, including policy adjustments, transparency measures, and trade policy reviews;
- (ii) Experience-sharing, capacity building, and advisory on the accession processes for non-WTO members (e.g., Azerbaijan: ex-ante impact assessment of WTO accession (2022) and Uzbekistan: Alignment of plant health legislations with WTO SPS Sanitary and Phytosanitary (SPS) Agreement (2018-2021);
- (iii) Study on mapping and reduction of nontariff barriers;
- (iv) Implementation of the WTO Agreements on Trade Facilitation, on Technical Barriers to Trade (TBT) and on Application of SPS Measures;
- (v) Better coordination of sectoral policies and priorities, evidence-based policymaking, and enhanced capacity of government agencies.



# ADB/CAREC Support for Turkmenistan's Accession to the WTO

Under TA 9712: Implementing the Integrated Trade Agenda in the Central Asia Regional Economic Cooperation (CAREC) Program

- To help CAREC countries increase market access, promote greater economic diversification and strengthen trade institutions
- \$2,400,000 covering Azerbaijan, People's Republic of China, Georgia,
   Kazakhstan, Kyrgyz Republic, Mongolia, Pakistan, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan,
   Uzbekistan
- Supporting Turkmenistan's accession to the WTO is a key priority



# **ADB/CAREC Support for Turkmenistan's Accession to the WTO**

### Preparation of the Memorandum on Foreign Trade Regime (MFTR)

- Engagement of technical advisors/WTO accession experts
- Introductory/kick-off seminar on the preparation of the MFTR (Dec 2020)
- Workplan for the draft MFTR, developed in consultation with the WTO Secretariat and Ministry of Foreign Affairs

### Potential activities in July-December 2023

- Capacity building and technical sessions on the preparation of the MFTR
- Knowledge-sharing on WTO accession among acceding countries in CAREC (Azerbaijan, Turkmenistan, Uzbekistan) at the sideline of the Central Asia WTO Forum in September 2023
- Joint activities with WTO and other development partners/donors to create synergies

# **Existing and Potential Support and Next Steps**

- Current ADB/CAREC TA 9712 to be completed in January 2024
- Subject to progress of current activities, ADB may seek further funding to continue technical assistance in the following areas:
  - capacity building for the negotiating team and the agency or unit to be established in-charge of WTO accession
  - ex-ante assessment on the impact of WTO accession of Turkmenistan
  - policy reforms needed to be aligned with WTO agreements
  - subregional knowledge-sharing or dialogue (esp. with other CAREC countries who are also WTO acceding members: Azerbaijan and Uzbekistan)
